Multi-Jurisdictional Drug Task Force Contract

At the June 22, 2015 Aldermanic Meeting I provided the Board of Aldermen the Multi-Jurisdictional Drug Task Force Contract covering the Federal fiscal year of October 1, 2015 through September 30, 2016. With changes in guidelines for Federal funding to multi-jurisdictional task force operations, the calendar year for funding and related mutual agreements and contracts has changed to a traditional calendar year. This change is requiring a new contract to address the date change.

I have reviewed the St. Louis County Police Multi-Jurisdictional Drug Task Force contract and outside of the date change the content is consistent with past contracts. The contract does require a new ordinance be passed by the City of Ballwin to permit us to enter into the agreement with St. Louis County. You will find the original agreement attached to this memorandum for your review. I have attached a copy of the 2015 legislation (Bill #3889) for your reference and convenience.

It is my recommendation that the City renew the contract with St. Louis County and that we continue to assign one officer to the unit. The City of Ballwin has benefited from the relationship we have established with the Multi-Jurisdictional Drug Task Force. I strongly believe a regional approach to the drug problem is by far the most practical and effective manner to attack the drugs in our community and the surrounding areas.

Two copies of the contract have been provided and will need to be signed before returning them to the St. Louis County Police Department. Copies of the City's Proof of General Liability Insurance and the current legislation are also required along with both signed copies. Please return all signed contracts, approved legislation, and the Proof of General Liability Insurance to me.
