This summer, our City received multiple recognitions for its safety and livability. My 1st TRYathlon

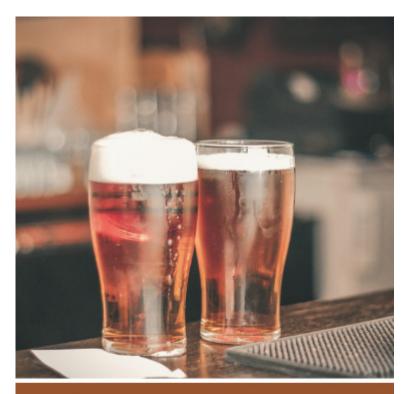
August 24 10 a.m.

In the KNOW

(Here's what's happened in Ballwin over the past few months)

- 1. In May, The Pointe was awarded "Favorite Recreation Center" by the St. Louis Municipal League! Thank you to everyone who voted!
- 2. We are pleased to announce the City, in partnership with MoDOT, will soon be installing Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons on Manchester Road near Old Ballwin Road at the existing pedestrian crosswalk, following expressed safety concerns. While Manchester Road runs through Ballwin, it is actually a state highway. This means MoDOT has complete authority on anything affecting traffic on Manchester Road. So once installed by the City, MoDOT will be responsible for the maintenance of these safety devices.
- 3. Our Comprehensive Plan was adopted at the June 3rd Planning and Zoning Commission meeting. To view the final plan, visit www.ballwinsblueprint.com. Our Annexation Plan was also recently accepted by the Boundary Commission.
- 4. Ballwin was named "The Safest Place to Live in Missouri" by HomeSnacks, whose scientific assessment is based on both violent and property crimes. We thank all the wonderful, vigilant residents who help keep this community safe!
- 5. Operations out of our new Government Center are going smoothly! Regarding the old, now-vacant Government Center, the City comissioned the Urban Land Institute (ULI) to provide an in-depth, objective assessment for the highest and best use of this site. The ULI recommended using this site as a civic space.
- 6. During Memorial Day weekend, the Golf Course partnered with the Forces on the Fairways foundation to host Ballwin Veterans Appreciation Day! There was free golf for veterans and a special trick shot show from PGA Hall of Famer Dennis Walters. We were also presented with a SoloRider, accessible golf cart, which will be permanently housed at our Golf Course. This cart is FREE for veterans, but can be rented by anyone who is mobility impaired, including seniors.
- 7. Our Ballwin Police Department will soon have a new Computer-Assisted Dispatching (CAD) System, which will offer the latest, cutting-edge technology to replace the department's current antiquated system.
- 8. We have a few new businesses that have recently opened. Check out XO Nail Bar, Class 101, and Super Slow Zone!
- 9. Our female police officers and detectives held a hands-on STEM event for local high school and middle school students. Students learned how STEM is used in everyday police work, were taken on a private tour of the police headquarters, and were even able to do some fingerprinting!
- 10. Ballwin was named one of the "Best Cities in Missouri to Live" by the Chamber of Commerce!
- 11. We are in the process of conducting a building needs assessment on our current police facility. The results are scheduled to be discussed during a fall Board of Aldermen meeting.
- 12. Ballwin Restaurant Charlotte's Rib BBQ made USA TODAY's top ten list for Best BBQ Ribs in Missouri.
- 13. The City is moving forward with the Holloway Road project, which will be 80% federally funded! The engineering contract was awarded to Cochran Engineering and construction is expected to begin in 2020. We were also awarded the STP grant for New Ballwin Road to do curb improvements and resurfacing. This will also be an 80% federally funded project.

Chief's Corner

Preparing the Chief's Corner article for the quarterly Ballwin Life publications is never difficult, as there are so many exciting things occurring in our overall Ballwin Municipal Services operation. I would like to take this opportunity to update you on an exciting police operational enhancement, as well as two programs, implemented by police team members, which focus on the attraction and cultivation of students to the American policing industry.

I would like to begin by telling you that in May, the Ballwin Board of Aldermen approved the purchase of a new Computer-Assisted Dispatching (CAD) system for Ballwin's Police Communications/911 operation, which is a service we have provided directly to our Ballwin customers since 1964. In addition, we have also provided police dispatching services to the City of Manchester for over 40 years. The new cloud-based CAD technology will be provided and supported by Soma Global, and will replace our old technology with state of the art capabilities, both within the communications center, as well as onboard in our patrol vehicles. CAD software is the centerpiece to efficient application of daily field operations, facilitating the dissemination and exchange of vital information from the police dispatchers to the officers in the field. Both the Ballwin and Manchester officers will be positively impacted by this upgrade.

The CAD project is extremely exciting from an operational perspective, but so are two programs that I would like to highlight for you. The very best of what the Ballwin Police Department offers originates from our team members. Perfect examples are our Law Enforcement Explorer Post and our Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) Program in Policing. Both focus on the attraction of student interest in this ever changing and vital industry.

Our Law Enforcement Explorer Post #9220 was implemented and coordinated by Officer Derek Loeffel (dloeffel@ballwin.mo.us). It is a hands-on program designed for those who are interested in a career in law enforcement. Post participation is open to young men



and women who have completed 6th grade through 20 years old. Our Explorer Post offers a front row seat to the criminal justice system through training, practical experience, competition, and other activities. The priorities of this program include individual personal growth, character development, a respect for the rule of law, physical fitness, good citizenship, and patriotism.

The Ballwin Police Department's STEM in Policing Program was developed and implemented by Ballwin Detective Jessica Ovca, and has focused on the cultivation of interest in young women as it pertains to the technical side of policing. This program has been offered to both high school and middle school aged female students. The emphasis is on giving girls the opportunity to work with Ballwin's female team members in order to learn about how they use STEM in their careers. Participants engage in hands-on learning about crime scene processing and science based investigative practices.

As Chief, I am very proud of the efforts and accomplishments of the men and women serving this community on a daily basis. You, our customers, are also our community partners. Two-way ownership is vital to keeping #BallwinStrong!

Police Department

In past issues, we have talked about how our officers are trained to deescalate situations and ultimately provided a more skillful approach to those who are in a mental health crisis. The program our officers, and officers around the region, participate in is called the Crisis Intervention Team.

On May 3rd, 2019 officers from around the region were recognized for going "above and beyond" to assist individuals or families who were in psychiatric crisis. Three Ballwin Police Officers were awarded the 2019 McAtee award.

Officer Bergin investigated a report of a suspicious person who had recently purchased a firearm. Officer Bergin was able to make contact with that person's parents, who advised he suffers from extreme depression and likely purchased the firearm to commit suicide. Officer Bergin's quick investigation led to the discovery of the subject by surrounding agencies. That person was found distraught in his vehicle with the firearm under his leg likely minutes from danger according to his parents. He was transported for treatment unharmed with the help of Officer Bergin's quick actions.

Officers Berry and Rader were dispatched to a residence to investigate a domestic disturbance. When they arrived, they observed a young child attempting to crawl out of a window of the residence to get away from a distraught father. Fearing for the child's safety, officers entered the home and convinced the father, who was having a mental health crisis, to release the child. Officer Berry and Rader's actions led to a safe outcome for all involved and the father getting immediate psychiatric treatment.





One of the things you learn quickly in police work is that there are a lot of random questions you will be asked. One we were recently asked was, "How the traffic lights work in the Ballwin area?" This is one of those pieces of equipment that we all use just about every day and these pieces of equipment hold some pretty interesting technology that help to keep us safe on the roads. During peak travel times many of the traffic lights are controlled by timers, which have been coordinated throughout the region to help keep traffic flowing (although some mornings it doesn't feel that way). For those times when traffic is not heavy, or in areas where timers are not the best option, sensors are used. A popular system used in the St. Louis area is an induction loop system. These loop systems consist of coils of wire that have been embedded into the surface of the roadway. The wire forms a loop (hence the name), which detects when a vehicle is present and sends a message to the traffic light to change. Another common system in the region is a camera sensor. These are noticeably located on top of the traffic lights and point towards the intersection. The idea behind the camera sensors is very similar to the loop system, except they are not embedded in the roadway. The cameras use "detection zones" instead of the embedded loops in the roadway. MoDOT told us they have been using the cameras more frequently due to them being easier to access and easier to repair. While cameras are located at many intersections, it should be noted that no video is stored as they are used only as sensors for the traffic signals.

Curbside Leaf Collection

It's almost fall, and you know what that means... our highly-anticipated Leaf Pickup service is scheduled to start soon!

Over the next several months, our Public Works department will resume its free, residential, curbside leaf collection program. You should expect to see our crews out collecting leaves from October to December, weather permitting. One crew will be assigned to each ward. If you do not know what ward your street is in, contact the Ballwin Government Center (636) 227-9000 or visit our website to utilize the Street Look Up feature.

Leaves raked may be put in appropriate yard waste bags or containers for pickup on yard waste collection days by the City's contracted waste hauler. Unlike trash collection, we cannot guarantee which day of the week your leaves will be collected. Crews will be collecting leaves Monday through Friday, on City streets both north and south of Manchester Road. Crews will begin each day where they ended the day before. Once leaves have been collected on all streets, our crews will begin another pick up cycle. There will be NO pick up on Thanksgiving Day, the Friday following Thanksgiving, Christmas Eve, or Christmas Day.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS

Please do not park on top of, or in front of, leaf piles. Leaves that are not accessible cannot be collected until the next cycle through the City. Crews cannot return to missed piles.

To minimize leaves washing into the sewers or becoming saturated during rainfall, do not put them in the gutter. Residents can put leaves in the center island of their cul de sac and our crews will collect these leaves.

As a reminder, this service is only provided to customers of the City's contracted waste hauler. Properties that have a separate contract are excluded from the curbside leaf collection. Residents are also reminded leaves will be picked up by the trash hauler as part of their yard waste collection, provided they are put in yard waste bags or separate containers. So if our timeline for pickup doesn't match your needs, there are other disposal options available to you.

For the safety of the workers and the equipment, sticks, plants, root balls, metal objects, bricks, logs, and animal waste must be kept out of the leaf pile. Piles of leaves with such debris will NOT be collected to avoid injuries and equipment damage, which will cause delays. Please do not block fire hydrants, storm drains, or mailboxes with your leaf pile.

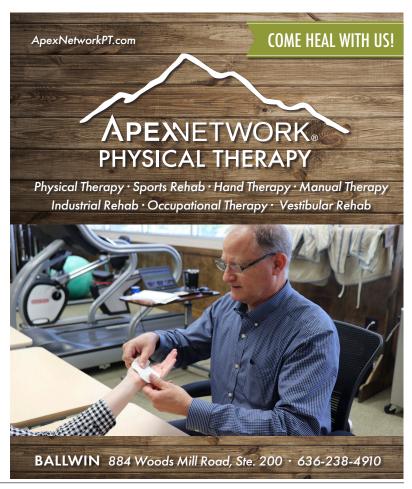
