From the Mayor

Tim Pogue

As we began another new year in the City of Ballwin, I reflected on all the services we as residents receive.

Our Police Department makes Ballwin one of the safest cities in the state, not just on paper, but in the way we feel and move about our community. Our Public Works Department maintains our streets all year round in every weather condition to keep them safe for our use. And our Parks and Recreation Department ensures we have ample opportunities to enjoy the great outdoors and remain active.

I firmly believe the residents of Ballwin deserve great services, which is one of the reasons I ran for mayor in the first place. Ten years on the job and I've seen first-hand how it takes great people to provide great service. Ballwin has some of the best staff in the business which is largely what contributes to our ability to offer the services we do at very little cost to our taxpayers.

Residents might find it interesting to know a little more about the staff who serve them on a daily basis. A total of 136 people are employed full-time by the City of Ballwin; 61 in the Police Department, 30 in the Public Works Department, 26 in the Parks and Recreation Department and 19 in the Administration Department.

Combined, our staff have nearly 1,800 years of experience working for Ballwin. They are committed to say the least.



It is these same great people who will carry out the priorities the Board of Aldermen and I have set for the next few years. Included among these priorities are possible annexation of unincorporated areas of the region, expansion of The Pointe's indoor pool, updating the golf course maintenance shed, renovating the police department building, improved pedestrian access across Manchester Road, and major road improvement projects.

I'd be remiss if I didn't mention the large role our local businesses play in the viability of our community. Their commitment to provide the goods and services to our residents is a vital piece in the puzzle of this vibrant city. For this reason, the Board and I have also directed our staff to explore new ways to engage and support our business owners going forward.

We believe better services start with people, not a bigger budget which is why year after year Ballwin keeps our property tax rate at \$0.00. And we intend to keep it that way.

Ballwin's New City Hall

Ballwin City Hall will be in a new location beginning April 1, 2019.

"We are extremely proud of this project. Building a new city hall 100% debt free is uncommon in the best sense of the word. Ballwin residents have always valued fiscal responsibility, and this is a perfect example of it," said Mayor Tim Pogue.

Staff located in the current city hall building will be transitioning on Thursday and Friday, March 27 and 28. Both locations will be closed beginning at 12 p.m. on Friday, March 28 for the last part of the transition, and full operations will begin at the new location beginning at 8 a.m. on Monday, April 1. Ballwin sincerely appreciates your patience during the move.

Two important changes to note: the Ballwin Board of Aldermen meetings and the municipal court nights will take place at the new location beginning in April instead of at the police station. The new address is 77 Seven Trails Drive and is located just down the block from the old city hall.

Understanding the 2019 Ballwin Budget

The 2019 budget is the City of Ballwin's fiscal plan for the next year. It sets the goals and objectives the City wants to accomplish, including capital improvements, street repairs and police programs.

The budget projects revenues the City anticipates collecting and its predicted expenditures during the fiscal year (January 1 – December 31).

The total expenditures of the operating and capital budgets are \$19,998,411. The graphs on the adjacent page help illustrate revenues and expenditures for the 2019 fiscal year.

Capital improvements have a separate budget and include completing the construction of the new City Hall building which will open April 1, 2019, replacement of the golf maintenance building, and engineering for the resurfacing of Holloway Road. This is a project for which the City will receive federal reimbursement for 80% of the project cost.

Sales taxes comprise 46% of the operating revenues for the City. These have fluctuated both up and down in recent years. Conscious of the ever-increasing growth in internet commerce, the City has taken a conservative approach and budgeted sales taxes to be flat in 2019 compared with 2018 projections.

Prior to 2017, sales taxes made up 41% of revenues. The dramatic increase is attributable to the new half-cent, county-wide sales tax for public safety (Proposition P)

which took effect October 1, 2017. These funds will only be used in support of our police department.

Unspent funds received in any fiscal year are held in fund balance and restricted for public safety.

Ballwin is also proud to share the Government Finance Officers Association of the United States and Canada (GFOA) presented a Distinguished Budget Presentation Award to the City of Ballwin, Missouri for its annual budget for the fiscal year beginning January 1, 2018. This is the third consecutive award of its kind for the City. The award reflects the City's commitment to meeting the highest principles of governmental budgeting. This signifies that Ballwin's budget rated proficient in serving as: a policy document, a financial plan, an operations guide and a communications device.


This award is valid for a period of one year. Ballwin believes the current budget continues to conform to program requirements and will submit it to GFOA to determine its eligibility for another award.

Where does the money in the Ballwin municipal budget come from?

Revenue is estimated based upon historical data, current economic conditions and any new or discontinued revenue source. The City of Ballwin applies a conservative approach when budgeting revenues and considers factors such as retail businesses that may be closing, new retail businesses and fee increases.

The City has had a \$0.00 property tax rate in place since 1987, so Ballwin is primarily reliant on sales taxes, utility gross receipt taxes, and recreation fees from its recreation / community center, aquatic center, and golf course.

What does Ballwin spend its municipal budget on?

Balancing where funds go to benefit our residents is an important part of creating a budget. Each fall the various departments draft an estimate of projects and their expenses to present to the Board of Aldermen for consideration. Then throughout the fall the Board works with city staff to set projects and priorities for the upcoming year.

Occupancy **Permits** and Occupancy **Inspections**

A common question heard at City Hall is, "What's the difference between an Occupancy Permit and an Occupancy Inspection?" More detailed information is provided below, but the short answer is this: An Occupancy Inspection is required when you want to sell or rent your home, and an Occupancy Permit is required when you are moving in to a new dwelling in Ballwin.

Occupancy Inspection

If you're planning to sell or rent your home or apartment, it must be inspected and cited violations must be corrected before a new tenant may take occupancy. It is recommended this inspection is done as soon as the unit is listed for sale or rent to allow enough time to correct any violations that may be identified.

To arrange for the inspection, apply in person at City Hall, via email or by fax. The "Occupancy Inspection Form- For Home Sale or Rental" can be found on the City of Ballwin's website under the Documents section.

There is a \$100 fee for this inspection which must be paid before the inspection is scheduled.

Occupancy Permit

If you're planning to live in Ballwin, whether purchasing or renting, you must apply for an Occupancy Permit. There is no fee for an occupancy permit.

The Occupancy Permit helps Ballwin ensure the number of people occupying a dwelling does not exceed the space limitation requirement of the Housing Code.

Before a new resident can obtain an Occupancy
Permit, an inspection of the property is required, and
a Certificate of Compliance must be issued.
Once a Certificate of Compliance is issued, it is valid
for one year from the issue date unless the property
is reoccupied. A new occupant requires a new
inspection.

Ballwin's New Building Code

Previously, Ballwin was operating under the 2006 Building Code. Throughout the course of last year, staff and elected officials worked to bring these codes more up to date.

Ballwin's building code was recently updated to the 2015 International Codes, with the exception of the electrical code which was updated to the 2014 standard.

To the average Ballwin resident, updating building codes doesn't sound all that exciting besides knowing things will be safer as building procedures evolve, but there is a piece that could affect you.

Ballwin's ISO rating (Insurance Services Office) is the classification given to insurance companies to help determine the liability associated with owning a home in Ballwin. Updating our building code plays a role in

keeping our ISO rating low which could impact home insurance rates for our residents.

Legislation for the new codes was first read at the August 27, 2018 Board of Aldermen meeting and a second time at the December 10, 2018 Board of Aldermen meeting where they were unanimously adopted. A six month grace period will be honored to allow adequate time to make the necessary changes.

Ballwin City Trees 2018 Recap


In total, the fourperson crew took down 198 trees and trimmed another 726 in 2018. This section of the public works department accounted for over 2,200 man hours.

Tackling that many trees in one year would not have been possible without the purchase of a larger bucket truck in 2017. The 2019 budget includes funds to purchase a second truck as the crew continues working through the remaining 295 trees on the work order list.

Street maintenance is an ongoing priority in Ballwin, and 2019 is no exception. After much consideration, the anticipated projects for this year have been set and can be explored on this page. The City of Ballwin strives to balance in-house work, which is often cheaper and more flexible, with contractual work in order to accomplish the most projects possible within our budget and according to our priorities.

Streets are maintained in a manner that provides safe travel for motorists and pedestrians. The goals of the department include: repairing and filling potholes, replacing deteriorated concrete slabs, sweeping streets, repairing deteriorated concrete pavement joints, sealing cracks and joints on concrete and asphalt pavements, overlaying asphalt streets, and pursuing federal funding for street improvements.





The Police Department saw some nice changes this past year. One major change to the Ballwin Police Department was the remodeling of our Emergency Communication Center. This change has positioned our emergency communication and dispatching services to be at the forefront of the next generation of emergency communication for the region, while also adding some needed improvements to their work environment. This past year alone our dispatch center answered tens of thousands of calls for Ballwin and Manchester residents.

Our police officers continued to provide excellent service to the community. They have truly worked together to make this year one to remember. Our officers all received training to become crime scene processors, were recognized for their excellent work on cases ranging from thefts to sex crimes, and built on an already strong relationship with the





Ballwin community. The majority of thefts reported from vehicles in the Ballwin area occur when the car or truck are left unsecured. There are times when a window is broken or a door is pried open, but generally this happens when valuables are left in plain sight.

It is not uncommon for multiple individuals to be involved in these types of thefts and they will divide and conquer checking every car in a neighborhood in under a minute. They are looking for anything from Electronics to loose change. The biggest wins for the thieves is when




Ballwin Police on Home Surveillance Systems

Technology has made home surveillance options more attainable for every home, including many in Ballwin.

There are many different types of cameras and features that make the process of purchasing a camera system exciting (or scary). One of the newer trends in cameras over the past couple of years is the rise of the doorbell camera. The benefits of this type of system are pretty obvious. They allow for you to be notified when there is motion at your door, when the button is pushed, and most have the ability for two-way communication with the person at your front door. These cameras are great for monitoring deliveries and staying alert to who is approaching your home. Often you can access live views of the camera feed even if a motion trigger has not been activated, so you could even check the weather while you are not home. The entry level for most of the cameras of this style are \$200-300.

More traditional security camera systems are also becoming much better in terms of video quality and price. The options to how the cameras work is also ever expanding. Systems can be wired, wireless, IP cameras, function on or off of the internet for remote viewing. The benefits of any camera system are plentiful and the options are very flexible for your lifestyle and your budget. The ease of installation for these types of systems can vary and in some



cases a professional company or electrician may be needed to ensure that they are installed safely. The entry level for cameras in this category can start as low as \$25.

Cameras have proven to be excellent resources for criminal investigations. They can provide not only descriptions of suspects and vehicles, but also timeframes for when crimes occur. Recently, exterior home surveillance cameras provided our Detectives with an abundance of information for an incident where numerous vehicles were entered on a street in the middle of the night. Not only was

the video helpful to our agency, but also to others in the region who were experiencing similar crimes. This type of evidence is incredibly helpful to show our officers and to learn from how these types of crimes occur. In the above mentioned crime, we watched as multiple suspects left their vehicles and spread out over the street to check the doors on cars. They had returned to their cars and left the area with stolen items, within one minute. This video provided a clear depiction of how fast these types of crimes occur and demonstrated how useful exterior cameras can be in a criminal investigation.

If you have a camera system on your home or business, please consider registering with the Ballwin Police Department in order to help investigators collect evidence. This program does not monitor the cameras, it simply notifies the police department "Cameras have proven to be excellent resources for criminal investigations. Ballwin Celebrates "Raymond L. Sontag Day."

A proclamation declaring December 16, 2018 as "Raymond L. Sontag Day" was signed by Mayor Pogue and presented to Raymond on December 16 in celebration of his 100th birthday. He was born December 16, 1918 and before moving recently, lived over 50 years in the City of Ballwin.

The proclamation was presented to Raymond in a room full of his family and friends and read in part:

Raymond L. Sontag has been a distinguished resident of the City of Ballwin since 1960 serving on the board of his subdivision as well as St. John's United Church of Christ.

In 1942, Raymond was drafted by the U.S. Air Corp, now the U.S. Air Force, and served in World War II stationed in North Africa as an airplane chief mechanic, repairing all types of pursuit and bombing airplanes, directly behind enemy lines.

In 1945, Raymond was honorably discharged after completing his final tour and shortly after in 1947 married his beloved wife Ruth and began a long and honorable family legacy.

Raymond served his community as a member of the Lion's Club, worked for over 40 years as a local Teamster truck driver for TreeCourt Supply, and participated for many years in the Ballwin Days Parade.

Raymond was recognized as Ballwin's "Outstanding Senior" in 2015.

Raymond embodies the example of a true gentlemen and patriot devoted to his country, his family and his community.

NOW, THEREFORE, in recognition of Raymond's accomplishments and 100 years of living life to the fullest, I, Tim Pogue, Mayor of the City of Ballwin, Missouri, do hereby proclaim December 16, 2018 "Raymond L. Sontag Day" in the City of Ballwin and I join with the Board of Aldermen and the entire community in commending him on this day.

Ballwin Business Spotlight: Six North Cafe

Six North is where it all started. The address that is. According to owner Maria Altrudo the name for the cafe came from it's original location, in the Six North Apartment Building.

Although the cafe is no longer located at Six North, the name stuck. Now, two locations serve thousands of customers every year, one of which is located right here in Ballwin at the intersection of Clayton Road and Henry Road. The second location is in downtown St. Louis in the Peabody Plaza.

Maria, her husband Mike and son Michael own and operate the two locations, but Maria says it was really her son Michael who brought the idea to life.

While living in Kansas City, Michael managed an Old Chicago restaurant and when he decided to move back to St. Louis he brought his experience to get the venture started. But why a cafe?



Maria recalls it all starting when her children were in high school. Every Friday the teenagers would come to the Altrudo household greeted with homemade chocolate chip cookies. When the kids graduated, Maria sent them each with a postcard addressed to the Altrudos requesting cookies. "Then whenever life got stressful they could send me the postcard and I would mail them some cookies." She said the farthest she ever mailed those cookies was to Japan.

That famous chocolate chip cookie recipe is the same one still used in the cafe today. In fact, many of Maria's original recipes are used at the restaurant including the tuxedo chip cookie, the oatmeal raisin cookie, the oatmeal raisin bars and the crisp rice treats.

Other menu items have also given the cafe a claim to fame. Chef Jerome, once a personal chef to Jackie Onasis, created the chicken salad sandwich recipe. He insisted on roasting chickens whole. It's a two day process, but they still use it now. Every item is cooked to order, and organic and gluten free options can be found on the menu as well.

Six North Cafe is more than just a place to grab coffee or a light meal though; for many residents it's a special place to gather.

It's the place where a group of women gather every Thursday to play cards. It's the place where readers gather for book signings by local authors on Saturday mornings. It's the place where college students gather to study. It's the place where many customers come every day because they love the food, staff and atmosphere. Some say it feels like an extension of home.

Six North is a strong supporter of the Ballwin community participating in Coffee with a Cop, Dine out options for various fundraisers, and the Shop Ballwin First program offering 10% off to residents who show their Ballwin key fob.

The Ballwin cafe is located at 14438 Clayton Road From breakfast and lunch, to catering and online ordering, Six North offers a little bit of everything.

That's the mission statement for the Palozola Foundation, established by Maria Palozola in 2017. Palozola, a Golf Professional and Owner of St. Louis Golf Lessons, has always been passionate about the sport. Her nephew, CPL Thomas K. Palozola, Jr. a Marine who also loved to golf, spent a lot of time and effort helping veterans after returning from duty. Together they had always planned to organize something golf-related for veterans. But it wasn't until after Thomas took his own life after suffering from PTSD the plan really took off.



A special Veterans Appreciation Day event is scheduled at the Ballwin Golf Course in partnership with the Palozola Foundation for Sunday, May 26, 2019.

The event will include a flag ceremony, games and food, the official presentation of the Solorider Golf Cart, a Dennis Walters Golf Show and then a golf tournament.

"When something like this happens, you're in shock. But it also kind of kick starts you to really see the need of the people who serve this country," said Maria. "It just hits you, and you know that now is the time to act."

And she did just that, forming the organization quickly with others who believed in the mission. The first fundraiser for the organization was held in October of 2018 and resulted in nearly double their fundraising goal.

Thanks to that fundraiser 'Forces on the Fairways,' a Solorider Golf Cart has been provided at very little cost to the Ballwin Golf Course. A special event is scheduled for the official presentation of the cart (see details above), but the cart is available for use now by residents and guests.

Ballwin is beyond grateful to receive the first cart from this organization and have it at the course for our wounded veterans and other golfers.
