AN ORDINANCE DEFINING THE ELIGIBILITY OF APPLICANTS FOR A LIQUOR LICENSE IN THE CITY OF BALLWIN.

WHEREAS, the Board of Aldermen is empowered by state statute to make and enforce ordinances for the regulation and control of the sale of all intoxicating liquor that are not inconsistent with the provisions of state law; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Aldermen deems it prudent to condition the eligibility for a liquor license upon an absence of a revocation or a conviction of liquor laws within three years of submission.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF BALLWIN, ST. LOUIS COUNTY, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> Section 3-43 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Ballwin shall be repealed and replaced with the following:

Sec. 3-43. - Persons ineligible generally.

No natural person shall be granted a liquor license unless such person is of good moral character and a qualified legal voter and taxpaying citizen of a county, town, city or village of the state; no corporation shall be granted a liquor license unless the managing officer of the corporation is of good moral character and a qualified legal voter and taxpaying citizen of a county, town, city or village of the state. No person shall be granted a liquor license whose license as a liquor dealer 2 or more times within 12 months before applying:

- a. has been revoked;
- b. has been convicted of a violation of the provisions of any law applicable to the manufacture or sale of intoxicating liquor; or
- c. employs in his business, as a liquor dealer or licensee, any person whose license within 2 or more times within 12 months before applying has been revoked or who has been convicted of violating the provision of any such law.

However, nothing in this section contained shall prevent the issuance of licenses to nonresidents of Missouri or foreign corporations for the privilege of selling to duly licensed wholesalers and soliciting orders for the sale of intoxicating liquors to, by or through a duly licensed wholesaler, within this state.
