**SUBJECT:** REJIS (Regional Justice Information System)

---

Mr. Kuntz,

At the November 26, 2018 Board of Aldermen meeting, City Attorney Jones, provided an overview regarding the municipal courts impending conversion to the mandated Show-Me Courts System in January of 2019. As you are aware Show-Me Courts is an evolving records and case management automation system developed to support the court's business. This conversion is being mandated by the Missouri Legislature pursuant to section 476.055.3.

During discussion by the Board, a question was raised about the status of REJIS services as the conversion progressed. The city attorney very accurately responded by stressing the need of continued REJIS services to access older records within court operations. This being said, I wanted to take this opportunity to present the fact that REJIS serves a different support role on the police side of operations, and although the court will be less reliant on REJIS services over time, the REJIS LEWeb (Law Enforcement Web Application) is center to police information sharing and it's value will not dissipate over time.

LEWeb is for Police, Correctional, State Highway Patrol, and Federal Agents to enter and access criminal, investigative and informational data. Officers having access to LEWeb can enter or inquire on the following:

- Over 4 million local arrest records from 1976 to present.
- Missing records entered by local, state, and out of state agencies.
- Local criminal history records entered and shared by over 200 police agencies.
- Gang data entered by greater St. Louis area police departments for the last 20 years.
- Local, state, and out-of-state wanted and warrant records.
- Local, state, and out-of-state stolen vehicle, vehicle parts, and stolen boat records.
- Stolen gun, article, and securities records from 50 states.
- Detailed driver registration and driver history for all 50 states and Canada.
- Vehicle registration records for all 50 states and Canada.
- Mugshot records and Mugshot line-up records.
- Google type record search called PowerLink, which allows the officer to search REJIS local records by simple one word search entries.
- Active jail and corrections inmate data from the St. Louis City Justice Center, St. Louis County Department of Justice, and the Jefferson County Jail.
- Social Security Administration Death Files.
- Locator search for a person's home address history by name or social security number.

The REJIS LEWeb component disseminates data from various types of government agencies located in our area, the State of Missouri, and across the country. This technology will remain a key component in our daily information sharing efficiencies within police operations.

As the City of Ballwin moves toward solidifying the court's conversion to the new Show-Me Courts System, I'm hopeful this information illustrates the REJIS impact on the policing side of operations, which differs from the court administrative process.
