

SHORT TERM RENTALS

Businesses, the economy, and society in general are all always changing. And one of the trends taking root amongst these changes is renting one's home to out-of-town guests.

Some travelers rent a bedroom for a night or two for a business meeting or conference. Others may stay weeks or months while they're in the area visiting family. This idea was made popular by the website Airbnb, and now the concept is in use across the internet and the country.

And Ballwin is no exception.

Earlier this year, discussions began about pursuing an ordinance in regards to allowing homeowners to rent out their homes. Previous Ballwin legislation did not specifically address short-term home rentals, but a related ordinance prevented residents from legally doing so.





Each side of the issue has to do with individual rights. Residents have the right to use their property how they see fit and their neighbors also have the right not to be negatively impacted by those decisions.

Residents on both sides gave input at a number of Board of Aldermen meetings before the issue was brought before Ballwin's Planning and Zoning Commission. The Commission voted in favor of an ordinance allowing such rentals in Ballwin.

The Commission then made an official recommendation to the Board of Aldermen who voted in favor of the ordinance, subject to certain regulations. The vote took place on April 23, 2018 and the ordinance went into immediate effect.

Those interested in renting their home in Ballwin, need to follow a few steps in order to be in compliance with the new ordinance. Learn more in the Code Enforcement section on the City of Ballwin's website.





"Mother Nature is the single biggest factor that impacts our work," said Superintendent of Streets Jim Link. This is especially true during leaf season.

You can expect to see crews starting to collect leaves at the end of October through early December.

They will continue collecting leaves as long as Mother Nature cooperates. Last season, the public works department was out picking up leaves well into January.

To get regular updates about leaf pickup during the season please visit www.ballwin.mo.us/leaf-pickup or follow the Ballwin Public Works Department on Facebook at www.facebook.com/ballwinpublicworks.

A few important reminders:

- Leaf pickup is only available to customers of the City's contracted waste hauler.
- We cannot guarantee your leaves will be collected each week or on a specific day. The pace of pickup is entirely dependent on how heavily the leaves are falling.
- Leaves will be picked up by your trash hauler if they are placed in yard waste bags or separate containers, so if our timeline doesn't line up with when you need leaves removed, this is another option.
- Do not park on top of or in front of leaf piles. Leaves that are not accessible will not be picked up and will have to wait until the next cycle to be collected.
- NO sticks, plants, roots, metal objects, bricks, logs or animal waste should be in any leaf piles. These items damage our equipment and are dangerous to our employees.

Ballwin's municipal court is held two times per month in the dual purpose boardroom/courtroom located at the Ballwin Police Department. On court night, the room is often buzzing with activity. There are defense attorneys, the prosecuting attorney, and a variety of other court members who are working to give everyone on the docket his or her opportunity to speak with the Judge.


Ballwin's Municipal Court is a division of the 21st Judicial Circuit. This court handles municipal traffic tickets and municipal ordinance violations only.

The major roles in the courtroom include the Judge, Virginia Nye, who began serving the Ballwin community in 2011. Judge Nye controls the courtroom and is the lead for the Ballwin Municipal Division. The Court Clerk's office is managed by Mrs. Christine Northcutt and Assistant Court Clerk, Ms. Mikki Spangler, who prepare court dockets and handle day-to-day operations for Judge Nye.

The Prosecuting Attorney's Office consists of Prosecuting Attorney Mr. Christopher Graville and his assistant, Mrs. Abigail Johnson. Mr. Graville began serving the Ballwin community as the Prosecuting Attorney in 2011. The Ballwin Municipal Division of the 21st Judicial Circuit works diligently to handle cases brought to the court with professionalism. Through their diligent work, they strive to better the Ballwin community on a daily basis.

Chief's Corner

Risky Behavior

I have the privilege to interact with many of you on a daily basis, through attending neighborhood meetings, conducting foot patrols in subdivisions, at school events, and even grocery shopping.

The topics of conversation vary widely, but one occurs more than the others...



Opioid addiction and addiction in general.

This is a topic that many of you have expressed as being a concern for our community and sometimes for the individual personally. It is a concern for me as well, both as the Chief of Police and as a member of this community. I have seen the impact addiction can have from my time on patrol and your police officers see these impacts on a daily basis. They can attest to the damage that is caused not only to the individual, but also to the ones they love when addiction has taken hold of someone's life.

In an effort to help bring this crisis under control, I asked a series of questions on social media about what the problem is and how we can move forward. These answers helped our team put together a program we titled Risky Behavior. On June 16th, 2018 we gathered with a packed house at the Ballwin Police Department and hosted an event to educate and to provide resources to those in need of help. The program was headlined by Mike Weiland,

from The Crossroads Program. Mike gave an honest and open presentation about the problem and programs that are available throughout the region. The organization Addiction is Real provided an interactive bedroom display entitled "In Plain View", which allowed participants to locate clues for risky behavior. Many other great organizations such as NCADA, Rockwood Drug Free, and Parkway Alliance for Healthy Communities were in attendance and had booths to provide information and resources.

This event was a small step to addressing the issues of addiction and the opioid crisis in our area. It is not something the Police Department can do alone. As this event showed, there are a lot of resources out there and a lot of people wanting to end this crisis. We will be holding another Risky Behavior presentation in the near future and are hopeful that we receive the same response from our community!

SRO: School Safety

Now that summer is coming to an end, it is time to really start thinking about the school year starting again. School Resource Officers Mike Hitchcock (Selvidge Middle School) and Randy Ferrell (Elementary SRO) are excited to get back in the schools and see the kids after a long summer break.

They have provided some tips for parents and students to make sure the school year gets off to a safe start.

- Have a travel plan. Making and implementing a travel plan provides the student and parents with a resource on what to do on a daily basis and also what to do if something out of the ordinary happens. Discuss and plan for what to do in the case of a early dismissal, snow cancellations, if a ride is late, etc. Tailor the plan to fit your needs.
- Ensure students know the contact information for parents, grandparents, day care, etc., so they can have a trusted adult contact the appropriate

- people if the child is lost or needs assistance. This can be accomplished in many ways, but a notecard in the backpack is a great start.
- Practice safe travel habits by wearing helmets on bicycles, seatbelts in cars, walking on the sidewalk, and using crosswalks to get to and from school.
- Ask questions. If you have any questions reach out to school officials or the SROs. They are there to help and are dedicated to seeing that all of the students have a safe and happy year.



Your Recycling Questions Answered

Recycling reduces waste, protects natural environments, minimizes pollution, and saves energy. We've all heard it before, but we don't always follow through.

Studies have shown 60% of what ends up in trash bins can be recycled according to an Earth Friends article published in October, 2017.

It's good to educate people on the importance of recycling, but it's equally important to encourage people to recycle properly.

Waste and Recycling Association, "About three in four Americans recycle. We all want to be "green" and protect the planet but a lot of us do not recycle correctly. Instead, we toss things in the recycling bin even when we don't know if it is recyclable. We hope that it will all just get sorted out at the plant. That's called "wishcycling" and is leading to more and more contamination in the recycling stream... We need the public to help us by recycling smarter."

Ballwin residents are encouraged to do their part in helping make recycling effective. Below you will find a chart provided by Republic Services you can use as a quick reference for knowing what types of material are and are not recyclable. If you have more questions about recycling or want to learn more please contact the City's contracted trash company, Republic Services.

City of Ballwin Holiday Service Guidelines

HOLIDAY SCHEDULE

There will be no collections on New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day or Christmas Day. The change in service days will be for that day on which the holiday falls. If the holiday falls on a Saturday or Sunday no change in weekly trash pickup will occur. – When the holiday falls on a weekday, ALL days following a holiday ROLL.

For Example:

If the holiday is on a Monday: Monday goes on Tuesday Tuesday goes on Wednesday Wednesday goes on Thursday Thursday goes on Friday Friday goes on Saturday

Christmas trees will be collected at no additional charge. The tree must be free of all decorations including tinsel, garland, ornaments and lights. The tree must also be cut shorter than six feet (6') in lendth.

Bulky Trash includes any type of solid waste that cannot be placed into trash cart. Bulky Trash does **NOT** include major appliances, electronics, automobile parts or components, construction debris or any other such items. These items are to be serviced on the last pick up day of the month and scheduled for collection.





RIES BRIDGE UPDATE

Construction began on the Ries Road Bridge at the end of May as soon as school let out for the summer. The project has remained on schedule and is to be completed in early September.

Ries Road (originally known as Oak Street) became a public road on November 25, 1907. The photo on the right shows the bridge in the year 1938.

The bridge currently being replaced on Ries Road (pictured above) was built in 1961. All construction is on track, and the bridge should be reopened as scheduled.

Once Ries Road reopens to traffic, work will begin on the second bridge project of the year on Ramsey Lane. The road will be closed to traffic and detour signs will be posted, likely beginning in mid-September.
