

Aspirational Recycling

5 Signs You Are an Aspirational Recycler By Republic Services

Should I? Shouldn't I? If you're asking yourself these questions as you toss something in your recycling bin, you might be an aspirational recycler. This happens when you aren't quite sure if something is recyclable or not, yet you still place that item in your recycling container, hoping that somewhere down the line it will be recycled or reused.

Common items that wrongfully end up in recycling centers include food, yard waste, plastic bags, clothing, and hoses.

Unfortunately "wish-cycling" is detrimental because it puts a lot of items in the recycling stream that don't belong there, can contaminate perfectly good recyclables, and can damage the equipment in recycling facilities. Aspirational recyclers generally have good intentions. Knowing the basic rules of recycling is vital so that those good intentions don't go to waste (pun intended).

Think you're an aspirational recycler? See if you're doing any of these things:

- 1. You don't know whether something is recyclable, but you hope it is. When in doubt, you should throw it out. Stick with the basics...
- 2. You recycle more than cardboard, paper, metal cans, plastic, and glass. Keep it simple and focus on items like water bottles, milk jugs, aluminum cans, and clean and dry paper & cardboard.
- 3. You confuse "recycle" with "reuse." Your old clothing, tools, and appliances can have new life, but not if you put them in your recycling container. Donate items for reuse to a local charity.
- 4. You toss items in the recycle bin with liquid and food still in them. Items must be empty, clean, and dry to be recycled. When they're not, they contaminate the perfectly good recyclables around them, sending some to the landfill.
- 5. You bag your recyclables. It sounds like a nice, neat way to keep your bin clean and collect recyclables. But the truth is that bagged recyclables can't be unbundled and sorted at the recycling facility. They'll go to the landfill nullifying your recycling efforts.

We know people want to recycle and have the best intentions; so, if any of this sounds familiar, don't despair. There are plenty of resources to help you know what and how to recycle at RecyclingSimplified.com. Once you've upped your recycling knowledge, don't forget to pass on the good recycling word! Make aspirational recycling a thing of the past.

Inspections & Permits

Our Code Enforcement & Building Inspections Division is responsible for overseeing & enforcing matters concerning the construction, alteration, and occupancy of all structures located in the City of Ballwin. Our team of trained & certified inspectors utilize a set of nationally-recognized codes for the safety and welfare of our citizens.

Summer is a perfect time to buy, sell, or fix up your home! However, there are a few things our Code Enforcement & Inspections team wants you to know to before you begin this process, to ensure it's as smooth as possible.

Occupancy Inspections

If you are planning to sell or rent your home or apartment, it must be inspected by a member of our team. If you are cited for any violations during this inspection, they will need to be corrected before you are allowed a change in occupancy. Our team recommends this be done when the dwelling is initially listed for sale or rent, in order to allow enough time to correct any violations found. Inspections can be arranged by filling out the Occupancy Inspection form on our website (under Documents) & emailing to inspections@ballwin.mo.us, or by coming in to the Government Center during business hours.

Occupancy Permit

If you are planning to occupy a residence in Ballwin, whether it is through a purchase or rental, you will need to secure an Occupancy Permit. This can be done by applying at the Government Center during business hours or by filling out the Occupancy Permit form on our website (under Documents) & emailing to inspections@ballwin.mo.us. The Occupancy Permit helps Ballwin ensure that the number of people occupying a dwelling unit does not exceed the space limitation requirement of the Housing Code. Before a new resident can obtain an Occupancy Permit, an approved inspection of the property is required.

Building Permits

Building permits are required in the City for all kinds of construction, including room and garage additions, basement finishes, sheds, fences, decks, and swimming pools. If you plan on constructing any of these items, it is necessary to apply for a building permit! These permits & forms can be found under the Documents tab on the City of Ballwin's website (www.ballwin. mo.us/Documents/).

Our occupancy & permitting program has been designed to maintain a quality-built environment and to ensure our community is beautiful & safe. All structures in the City are subject to inspection when there is a change of ownership or occupancy to ensure the standards of construction and maintenance are preserved. Questions? The City of Ballwin has officially broken ground on the new Ballwin Police Station, which will be located at the corner of Kehrs Mill Road and Ballpark Drive.

The current department, located at 300 Park Drive, has served the Ballwin Police Department for over 50 years. When the building was initially constructed in 1970, it housed several departments including administration, parks and recreation, municipal court, and police. The last major remodel to the facility occurred in 1999, after the City's administration department moved out to a separate building.

In 2019, the City hired JEMA to conduct a third-party needs assessment to analyze the conditions of the current station and identify opportunities for enhancement. It was determined that the station was not only in need of many major repairs and updates, it was also out of compliance with ADA, life safety, and storm-shelter requirements. For example, the current station was determined to have no storm shelter or area of refuge per building code, improper ventilation, poorly-insulated



windows, failing roof repairs and blisters, cracking in foundation wall, no ADA access to lower levels, undersized prisoner processing area, unsecure parking for police vehicles, and several more issues.

To address this, JEMA presented options for remodeling the current facility as well as building an entirely new structure. In the end, the Board of Aldermen made the decision to construct a new station, as there was not a significant cost savings to do an extensive remodel to the current facility. On January 24, 2022, the Board awarded the construction of the project to Wright Construction Services, Inc. The total cost of the project is approximately \$13.6 million and is being paid for with no debt to the City. Funds for the project are coming from the City's fund reserves and federal stimulus money.

The new station is expected to be completed by spring of 2023 and will have underground parking, updated amenities, an improved ventilation system, full ADA compliance, safer entry ways for our officers and visitors, and much more. We are excited to embark on this new adventure and look forward to building a safe, modern facility to serve the current and future needs of our officers and the community.



New Ballwin Road

This year, we will resurface a portion of New Ballwin Road, from Manchester Road to Twigwood Drive, to address deteriorated pavement, curbs, and gutters. Benefits include a smoother driving surface, upgraded and more cost-efficient street lighting, and intersection pedestrian signals. The City will receive federal reimbursement of 80% of the construction costs. The project is a collaboration between the City, the Missouri Department of Transportation, and the East-West Gateway Council of Governments using Surface Transportation Block Grant Program funds to assist in the costs of the project.

It's important to understand this is a resurfacing project and not a street reconstruction. Since this project was made possible by a grant, the City is bound to the project specifications submitted during the grant process, and is limited in its ability to work outside of the approved scope of the project. That being said, we will take into account the input received from our community and work to implement any possible suggestions, while continuing to stick to the project scope and remain fiscally responsible.

Mosquito Prevention

It's that time of year... the days are longer, the weather is warmer, the flowers are blooming... and those pesky mosquitos are out & about! While the City does offer a free, mosquito-control service every summer, we wanted to provide a few helpful tips on how you can prevent & control mosquitos in your yard.

- 1. Remove any standing water (this is where mosquitos breed). This includes weekly emptying of any items that hold water, like buckets, toys, and flowerpot saucers. If you can, tighlty cover water storage containers so mosquitos cannot get inside to lay eggs. Make sure to keep your swimming pool water treated & circulating. If you have a temporary pool, make sure to always drain them!
- 2. Use appropriate pesticides outdoors to control mosquito larvae and adult mosquitos.
- 3. Keep mosquitos away from exposed skin by wearing long-sleeved shirts, pants, and socks.

This year's Mosquito Control program will begin on May 16th. Crews will fog Ballwin neighborhoods Monday - Thursday beginning at 8:30 p.m. An EPA-approved, water-based insecticide is used, which is safe for humans & animals. Police

Chief's Corner



When we think about a police department, we think about uniformed officers, cars with lights on the roof, body-cam video showing officers chasing someone, and the voice on a radio transmission that is almost impossible to understand (but the officer hears it perfectly). What most people don't think about is the voice on the other end of that radio. That voice, those people, are the focus of this article.

The Communications Center is the heartbeat of any department. They are the first voice you hear when calling for help and they are the lifeline for the police officers on patrol.

Many departments have opted to pay to have these services provided by another, larger agency. As an example, the St. Louis County Police Department provides communications services for many municipal police departments. Within the Ballwin Police Department, we have a full-time, professional Communications Center that supports both the Ballwin and Manchester Police Departments 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

We have 11 Communications Officers, and each one deserves the highest level of respect and admiration. Let me explain why. Each Communications Officer spends their first 16 weeks in training, where they must pass a number of certifications and learn ALL of the systems they are expected to monitor, manage, and use. These systems include the Computer Aided Dispatch system (which is used to track every call for police), the Regional Justice Information System (REJIS), the Missouri Uniformed Law Enforcement System (MULES), the National Crime Information Center (NCIC), the Missouri Department of Revenue database (DOR – Vehicle and Drivers licensing), and the License Plate Recognition (LPR) system.

In addition to those systems, they monitor between six and eight different radio frequencies and answer incoming calls. In 2021, there were over 46,000 incoming telephone calls, of which over 14,000 were 9-1-1 calls. Those calls resulted in our Communications Officers dispatching officers on over 29,000 calls for service - while also monitoring and supporting the officers throughout every call.

Yes, these are incredible numbers. And they are handled by incredible people. So next time you see a police officer, notice the radio on their belt... and think about that person on the other end... the Communications Officer!

Crime Scene Investigation


Since the first airing of CSI in October 2000, public interest in the collection of evidence has skyrocketed. The show has placed some unrealistic expectations on the current technology available for evidence collection, but it has also been very informative to the public about the importance of evidence and evidence collection at a crime scene. Our department's Crime Scene Processors have dedicated training to collect and preserve evidence, as well as a plethora of equipment at their disposal.



Crime Scene Processors photograph scenes, locate and lift fingerprints and shoeprints, locate and collect DNA from crime scenes, and create molds or impressions of various types of tool marks and tire prints. There are different tools that have to be used depending on the weather conditions of the scene and the location of the type of evidence that is to be collected. This is a very hands-on, time-consuming, and often dirty job.

One of the most-used and most-common types of crime scene processing is the process of photographing the scene. To the untrained eye, it may appear that the officer photographing a scene is taking photos at random. However, that is far from the truth. Scene photography consists of specific sequences of photos that are taken in order to accurately capture the scene in order, to show both an overview of the scene and individual details of the scene in a way that can accurately depict the location, size, and condition of evidence to a jury at a later time.

While we love the idea of being able to neatly close a case within the allotted 46 minutes without commercials, that is not the case just yet, but who knows what the future holds.

Community Affairs

Did you know the Ballwin Police Department has officers assigned to a Community Affairs Unit? These officers work within the community to assess various situations and utilize one of many resources to solve problems. They will look at reoccurring or potential issues and address them personally with the hopes of solving it. The officers do not only serve the residents, but our Ballwin business as well.

There are several programs offered within the unit, including In Safe Hands, Caring Partners, Neighborhood Watch, and many more. In Safe Hands is a program for residents with special needs. There is no age restriction to participate, but you must be a resident of Ballwin, Manchester, or Winchester. It is designed to assist in reuniting families when a family member has wandered away. It asks various questions that can help give a responding officer the background information needed to locate the family member quickly as possible.

The Caring Partners Program is a service aimed towards assisting older residents who may be in poorer health or live alone. The resident can set up a designated time for a daily phone call from Ballwin Communications. If the phone call is not answered, the Ballwin Police will be dispatched to the residence for a welfare check. This is a helpful service, especially if other family members live out of town. It provides a sense of security, knowing someone can always check on a loved one. This is a free service which can be set up or canceled at your convenience.

Are you tired of seeing or hearing stories about neighborhood vandals... well the Neighborhood Watch Program might be just what you need! Please contact the Ballwin Police Department to set up an appointment with the Community Affairs Unit. The officers will teach you valuable lessons on how to deter crime and spot suspicious activity. Upon completion of the program, you can purchase sign(s) to be posted on lamp posts! All the important lessons are just a simple phone call away, so contact your local (and favorite) police force, the Ballwin PD.

And finally... the Community Affairs Unit loves the dedication shown by young scouts during the process to get specific badges. The Community Affairs Unit will often do presentations and tours for the young webelos. If you know or are in charge of a troop, please feel free to call us to set one up.


