

411 on hiring a CONTRACTOR

If you have been thinking about a home improvement project at your house, a major decision you will have to make first is selecting and hiring a contractor. Believe it or not this may be one of the most important decisions you will ever make and you need to be very careful and thorough with your analysis if you want to avoid problems later.

Here are some tips:

- 1. Check with friends, neighbors or co-workers to find out if they have used a contractor they were happy with. If at all possible, look at the work that was done and ask about their experience.
- 2. Look at websites that give ratings or reviews, including the BBB of Eastern Missouri.
- 3. When you consider a contractor, look at how long they have been in business.
- 4. Look for local contractors who work in your area as opposed to someone from out-of-town. This is especially important when contractors descend on the area after a major storm has caused widespread damage to houses and property.
- 5. Make sure they are locally licensed and if they are trade contractors like electricians, plumbers or mechanical contractors, make sure they are trained and licensed tradesmen.

- 6. Before you hire a contractor get several bids or estimates. This will help assure you that you are getting a good price.
- 7. Make sure your contractor gets all required permits.
- 8. Ask you contractor to give you a list of references. Call these references and visit if possible.
- 9. Ask for proof of liability insurance and worker's compensation insurance.
- 10. Agree on how payments to the contractor will be made and when. Try to limit your down payment.
- 11. Get a written contract.

Kirsten Hochstetler is a force to
be reckoned with. A member of
the cross country and track teams
at her high school, she continued
to run for Wartburg College in
lowa throughout her collegiate
years. Now, in her career as the
Communications Specialist for the
Parks and Recreation Department,
Kirsten runs at least six days a week
to stay on track to meet her goals.

We got together with Kirsten to ask her how she prepared for and completed the Boston Marathon.

Why did you decide to run in the Boston Marathon? It's been on my bucket list for a long time and I qualified for the race at the GO! St. Louis marathon last year. I decided it was a good time in my life to accomplish this goal.

How do you prepare for a 26.2 mile race? I followed an 18 week running plan where I started with 10 mile long runs each week, building up to 20 miles. I did three 20 mile

runs before the marathon, never actually running a full marathon until the race day.

What was it like being a part of this Marathon? It was a surreal experience knowing I was a part of such a historic race. The volunteers were a big part of this race, and were a great encouragement along the way. The support from my friends and family and even strangers was very humbling. This was the biggest race I've ever been a part of and with such large crowds there was no time to think of anything except being thankful for all the support.

Did you ever feel like stopping at any point during the race and what kept you motivated? There's always a time where you want to stop and walk. But I knew if I stopped to walk I wouldn't start running again! I had to ignore my body telling me to stop and just keep going. This was a long-time goal for me and my mantra of recognizing all the blessings in

my life as I was running was great motivation.

What was your favorite experience during the race?

Around mile 25.5 there was a girl who was struggling to keep going. Two guys were on either side of her who were helping her keep moving. As runners, we get it. Instead of calling for help, we get each other to the finish line because that's our common goal.

Would you run this marathon again? It's up in the air. I thought this would be the pinnacle of my running career, but I have a feeling I'll be running another marathon in the future. It's addicting!

Running at an average pace of 07:59 per mile, Kirsten completed the marathon in three hours, seventeen minutes and seventeen seconds. She placed 6862 overall and 1117 in her division. Congratulations Kirsten on your successful race. We wish you the best of luck on your next marathon!

The official start of summer is just around the corner and many are finalizing plans and packing the last bag for some exciting summer plans. In order to maximize the fun, it is a great idea to review some summer safety tips to keep danger away.

Keeping your home safe during the summer months is one of the easiest ways to ensure your vacation plans are not ruined by returning to a headache. Before leaving on vacation or an extended trip notify a trusted neighbor of your absence so they can be on alert and watch your property for any suspicious or out of the ordinary activity. You can also complete the Ballwin Police Department's Vacation Check form found on the police page at www.ballwin.mo.us. This notifies the patrol officers to conduct extra patrols in your area while you are gone. Always lock windows and doors before leaving home in an effort to prevent any easy access to the interior of your residence.

The high temperatures during this time of year pose a number of risks for our elderly neighbors. While it is important for those higher risk

individuals to recognize the dangers of extreme temperatures, it is also something that you can do for your loved ones or neighbors. This can be done with simple gestures like offering to help with yard work, or just stopping by for a short visit to say "hi" to ensure that they are in a safe environment.

These high temperatures can also pose a threat to our youngest citizens and furry friends. Over the past several years there have been numerous high profile cases of children being left in vehicles during high temperature days. We have also seen this happen with pets. This is a trend we believe can be stopped. Do whatever it takes to remember to remove the child from your parked vehicle and if you see an unattended child or pet in a hot vehicle immediately call for help.

Hello! My name is Krystal Rock

and I've been a Ballwin Police Officer for about four months. I studied Criminal Justice at Maryville University and as a program requirement I was required to do an internship. I was assigned the City of Ballwin by my Criminal Justice instructor, Geriann Brandt. She did me a huge favor by introducing me to this city.

I moved to Missouri in 2014, in order to play softball at Maryville University. I had no intentions of becoming a police officer, or staying in Missouri. However, as I began taking classes, I became very interested in the Criminal Justice Program that Maryville had to offer. I was actually planning on becoming a grade school teacher somewhere in California, or enlisting in the army once I graduated, not planning to remain in Missouri once I graduated. I was convinced by multiple people that becoming a police officer was the right fit for me, and they were right!


Before my internship, I had never heard of the Ballwin Police Department. While interning, I became familiar with some of the men and women who worked for this department. I specifically remember riding with Officer Ackermann multiple times. During our ridealongs he convinced me that I would be a great addition to the department if I ever chose to attend the police academy and become an officer. Sure enough, I entered into the St. Louis County Police Academy in June, 2016. And just a short time after that, I was applying for a job to be a Ballwin Police Officer!

On December 13, 2016, I graduated from the Police Academy, proudly wearing a Ballwin uniform. Beginning my career as a police officer for the City of Ballwin is exactly where I want to be. During my internship, I quickly learned that Ballwin is an amazing place to work. I am proud to serve the Ballwin community. I have entered into a line of work that is one big family, and there is no other career like it.

Are you Ready for

One of the growing trends in fraud is ransomware. Ransomware is a type of malware that restricts access to your computer and requires the victim to pay a fee or ransom to the fraudster in order to regain access to your computer. Typically, ransomware is spread by opening a suspicious email or visiting a website which has already been infected by the corrupt

software. If you receive an on-screen alert demanding you pay a fee or stating your files have been locked you are more than likely the victim of a ransomware scam. Generally, the ransoms requested are approximately \$100-\$300 and are increasingly being paid with digital currency, such as Bitcoin.



Once your computer is infected with ransomware it is difficult to retain all of your data. Therefore it is strongly recommended your computer data is frequently backed up in a separate location. There are many options to store and protect your digital files, so we recommend speaking with a professional to figure out what is best for your situation. It is always recommended to avoid opening suspicious emails and visiting unknown websites.

What do I do if my computer is locked?

While paying the ransom may recover the locked files in some cases, it generally opens you and your computer up to being involved in frequent ransomware scams with the cost of the ransoms increasing over time. It is recommended in all cases of extortion you immediately contact your law enforcement agency in order to report the ransomware event and to request assistance. The Ballwin Police Department works with various local, State, and Federal agencies in an attempt to resolve these issues in the most effective way possible.





Last year the Ballwin Police Department took over 50 reports for theft from vehicles. These cases resulted in a total loss of over \$27,000 for the victims. In many of the cases the vehicle was not locked and valuable items were left in plain view. The simple action of locking the doors to your vehicle can be enough of a deterrent to prevent these crimes, in many cases. Ballwin Police Sgt. Dan Hawk said, "We highly recommend removing any valuable items from your vehicle and keeping items of value out of sight, if they are unable to be removed from the vehicle." These easy to implement tips can keep your property safe and help eliminate this frustrating crime trend in Ballwin.

I hen someone at the government center answers your question on the phone it is easy to thank this person for his or her help. When you take lessons from Ballwin's PGA Professional at the golf course, "thank you" is a simple way to end your time with him. When you see a Ballwin Police Officer directing pedestrians safely across the street or the public works crew out maintaining those streets it is natural to send a wave or nod of thanks. There are however a number of city employees who are not quite as visible or easy to thank. Some of these people include the hard working individuals who make up our Building Systems crew.

Dave Lorenz, a Tech 2 for Ballwin, recently earned the 'Above and Beyond Award' for his dedicated service to the community. The work he does on a daily basis is certainly less visible to the public eye, but no less noteworthy. In fact, he personally has saved the city and you, the tax payer, quite literally tens of thousands of dollars over his tenure in Ballwin.

Each day Dave does routine readings and checks on all the equipment in the various buildings owned and operated by the city. Each month he inspects every unit, performing necessary maintenance to keep them all running smoothly. He checks belts and bearings, rebuilds pumps, fixes AC and furnace units, builds structures, handles electrical problems and most recently rerouted an entire leaky plumbing line at North Pointe Aquatic Center.

As you can imagine, contracting out any one of these jobs would be very expensive for the City. Add them all together and you can see why Dave is a major asset to Ballwin.

His nomination read in part, "His extensive mechanical knowledge and ability to make critical repairs no matter the time of day or season has and continues to save the City substantial amounts of money. Genuinely friendly and respectful, he completes some of the dirtiest jobs, even with a smile on his face."

Chances are you've seen some of Dave's handy work around Ballwin and just didn't know he was one of the people who should be thanked. He built the pavilion in Ferris Park, the pavilion in Holloway Park and the dock in the lake at New Ballwin Park. "I like making things, the major projects are my favorite," Dave shared.

Dave was raised in St. Louis City and after taking five semesters of welding went to work in a factory. For the

last 30 years he's been employed by the City of Ballwin and continued receiving training for as many technical concepts as he could. He went through blueprint reading, AC/ Cooling, electrical and more. "The City rewarded me for everything I learned. School is great and you can learn a lot, but you also learn so much from people with great experience, which I was fortunate enough to do."



BEHIND THE SCENES



you've lived in Ballwin long you're bound to have memories of Ferris wheel rides, parades, concerts, 5ks, and kids activities at Vlasis Park in the summer. Ahhh... Ballwin Days. This is an iconic festival all Ballwin residents take pride in. Attracting thousands of attendees, the event is a highlight of the summer for many people living in West County.

While there's no question how much fun Ballwin Days can be, many people do have questions about the logistics of the weekend. We sent Ballwin staff digging to get the inside scoop on just how this beast that is Ballwin Days is put together each year.

Before the rides are set up, before the bands are booked and before the kids are laughing there is planning, planning and more planning.

Ballwin Day is largely organized by a volunteer committee. The Ballwin Days Volunteer committee is comprised of approximately 50 active members who each tackle one or more areas of the festival. Subcommittees include entertainment, parade, facilities, sponsorships, carnival rides, fireworks,

recycling, transportation, concessions, pretty baby contest, outstanding senior and more. Not to mention Ballwin staff who also pitch in to help set up the park, provide security, and organize the Ballwin Days races and other activities.

Each subcommittee is committed to providing the best experience for Ballwin Days attendees as possible and they also want to make a difference in the community. "Not everyone knows that a large majority of the food vendors at Ballwin Days are nonprofits who are there to raise money and awareness for their cause," commented Director of Parks and Recreation Linda Bruer, "or that the Pretty Baby Contest has donated over \$70,000 to Cardinal Glennon Children's Hospital over the years."

The volunteer committee holds their first meeting in February and meets monthly thereafter leading up to the big weekend. We calculated over 1,000 volunteer hours invested by the committee alone from planning through implementation of the event. If you think that's a lot let's take a look next at how Ballwin staff rallies to make this event possible.



PUBLIC SAFETY

The men and women of the Ballwin Police Department invest a great amount of time during the Ballwin Days weekend. From managing the safety and security of the park to working out road logistics for the parade and races, Ballwin's Police Department actually works 24 hours a day for the duration of the festival.

The number of officers on duty has fluctuated over the years but typically there are between 4 and 8 officers on duty at the park around the clock and often there are off duty officers working security as well.

Another large role BPD serves is having an emergency evacuation plan in place in case of severe weather which had to be implemented a couple of years ago. With so many people out in the elements and limited time to transport them to safety, it's important to have a detailed plan in place to ensure maximum efficiency in case of emergencies.

Ballwin's Police Department works closely with the Ballwin Days Committee to handle all the logistics for these circumstances and while they work tirelessly to keep the park safe there are still many things the public can do to help.

A few things to remember when you head to Vlasis Park this summer:

- •There is no parking available in the park but shuttles are provided. Please use these shuttles instead of trying to cross over busy roads on foot.
- •No alcohol is to be brought into the park
- •No dogs are allowed at the festival
- •Stay hydrated! Summer weather can be hot so take care of yourself and find shade and water often.

PREPARING THE PARK

eginning Tuesday the week of the event there are five parks department employees, three building systems employees, and five public works employee working eight hours each day to set up the park. This includes setting up the stage and tents, balancing the power for six power distribution channels, preparing plumbing, setting up snow fence around hazardous areas, and picking up all the rented electrical equipment, ramps, sound equipment, and utility vehicles. It's safe to say these employees have their hands full.

Setting up is a big project, but another factor that adds to the magnitude of this event is preparing for the "what ifs." What if it rains? The crew already has 10 tons of sand close by to lay down if need be. What if it's extremely hot? Metro West Fire District is always on-site and will bring a misting station if necessary. What if a storm is on the way? The committee has an emergency plan in place which involves working with the police department to evacuate the park. The planning, set up, and tear down is extensively planned and well executed.

For two days following the festival there are at least eight employees working eight hours a day to clean up the park from tearing down tents to picking up trash and returning all the rented equipment. Add all those hours together and you'll find about 544 man hours invested by city staff just in preparing and tearing down the park.

For those who like to see numbers, here are some other Ballwin Days Fun Facts:

- •Over the years Ballwin Days has sold between 49,600-138,880 ounces of beer each year. That's between 25-70 half barrels of beer.
- During the festival someone cleans the restrooms in the park and at the police station every hour, on the hour and the porta potties are served twice a day each day of the event.
- •Ballwin Days requires 10 light towers (two of which are solar), 6 speakers used for important PA announcements, seven utility vehicles, 25 power pack extension cords, 19 porta potties (two of which are handicap accessible), 8 hand-washing stations, 7 food vendors, all of which result in thousands of combined hours of fun for all the attendees!





Low Enrollment Policy

Each class session is designed to accommodate 3-5 participants over the course of 8 class meetings. However, swim lesson classes will not be canceled due to low enrollment. 



Drop Off and Pick Up Procedures

In the morning as you drop your child off please double check they have their lunch, water bottle, appropriate shoes and clothing, and sunscreen.

Since some camps serve a large range of ages, campers will be divided into smaller sections based on their age. Counselors will greet you each morning and get your child checked in and placed into his or her group.

When you register, you will have the opportunity to indicate who is allowed to pick up your camper at the end of the day. For campers' safety, counselors will only allow children to go home with someone who is on the safe pick up list. A photo ID is also required to check your child out of camp. Inclement Weather- General

Ballwin Summer Camp is an outdoor based camp. In the case of inclement weather camps will be moved inside The Pointe or The Ballwin Golf Course. In the case of high temperatures camp will adapt a schedule of light activities and water games.

Inclement Weather-Brave Camp

In the event of inclement weather. Brave Games Camp may be canceled in the interest of camper safety. If such action is deemed necessary, the call to cancel camp for the day will be based on weather information available by 6:00 am on the day in question. If camp is canceled phone calls will be made using the household phone number on file by 6:30 am. If a day of camp is canceled for weather The City of Ballwin will issue a credit in the form of Ballwin Bucks. Camp will not be canceled simply for light rain or the forecast of light or scattered showers throughout the day. Predictions of thunderstorms or other severe storms, flash floods or tornadoes will be grounds for cancellation. All cancellations will be done at the discretion of the City of Ballwin Parks and Recreation Department.

Refund Requests

A full refund will be made to all registrants when a camp is canceled.

A refund will be granted if written cancellation is received at least one week prior to the start of camp less a \$15 fee.

No refunds are available less than 7 days before camp starts.

Transfers will be granted based on camp availability but a \$15 fee will be assessed if the transfer request is made less than 7 days before camp starts.

A pro-rated refund will be made to any registrant who cancels due to a health reason after a confirmation has been received from their health care provider less a \$5 service fee. If requesting a refund due to illness a written request accompanied by the physician's statement must be received no later than 7 days after seeking medical treatment.

Lost and Found
