Mayor's Letter

Dear Friends and Neighbors,

The fall season in Ballwin is one of my favorites as the leaves turn and the air gets cool and crisp. It's a great time to watch those exciting fall sports, as well as get out and enjoy the fall season with hikes in our parks or by participating in the Moonlight Howl.

Fall is also the time of year we look back on all that was accomplished during the warm summer months, including the progress of our annual street maintenance program. Maintaining quality streets and sidewalks remains a top priority for me and the Board of Alderman. Each year we work to allocate over one million dollars to improve as many areas of the city as possible. Given the ever-increasing costs of street

improvements, we are always searching for new and better ways to improve our infrastructure for motorist and pedestrians. A new initiative the board approved this spring involves the purchase of two pieces of equipment we believe will not only make our operations more efficient, but also allow staff to increase the amount of street and sidewalk replacement annually. This fall, the city took possession of our first multi-purpose truck that contains a mobile cement mixer. This unit will allow staff to generate cement on-site at approximately 30-40% less cost per yard. The combination of cost savings per yard and the ability to produce cement on demand year round will allow staff to increase the number of streets, sidewalks, and curbing replacement projects without increasing costs to taxpayers. The second piece of equipment is a new paving machine. For the first time, the Public Work's staff will be

able to resurface streets in-house saving both time and money. We are scheduled to overlay two streets this fall with many more to come in the future.

As always, the city staff will continue to work hard to keep our roads and sidewalks in great shape. I am excited to see the impact both machines will have to improve the overall quality of our infrastructure over the coming years. Whether you live, work or play in Ballwin, we strive to maintain the quality services you expect. This is just one of the

many reasons to call this great community home.



DOES MY SEWER LATERAL QUALIFY FOR THE BALLWIN SEWER LATERAL REPAIR PROGRAM?

what is a sewer lateral is the pipe that carries sewage from the house to the sewer main, which is owned and maintained by Metropolitan Sewer District (MSD). It starts on the outside wall of your house and continues to the sewer main. The building sewer is located under your house and is not covered by the program.

The most likely indication of a damaged or failing lateral, is a backup in your house, which usually occurs in the basement. At first, it may only occur when you are running a lot of water, such as when you are using an automatic clothes washer. As it gets worse, even taking a shower or flushing a toilet will cause a backup.

Sewer leaks are another problem with sewer laterals, but this problem most likely will not show up as a backup. With a sewer leak, the problem is untreated sewage leaking out into the environment through a yard or into an adjacent street, storm sewer or creek. The indications can be a bad odor, presence of black or gray colored water and in some instances, undermining of yards, sidewalks or street slabs.

DOES ALL DAMAGE TO A LATERAL QUALIFY UNDER THE PROGRAM? No. Most older

sewer laterals in the city are constructed of clay pipe. The pipe has a tendency to crack, break, separate at joints and allow roots to penetrate the pipe. These defects can exist while the sewer lateral functions normally. Roots can penetrate these defects and cause blockages. If the roots are slow-growing and can be maintained by clearing out on an annual or greater basis, the City considers this, normal maintenance of the pipe. If the roots grow at a faster rate and need to be cleared from the line more than once annually, this is considered a covered repair.

In addition, if a lateral is causing a health hazard by leaking raw sewage into the ground around it, the repair could be covered.

Many times, we receive applications for repairs when a house is being sold. The buyer has a lateral inspection completed and notices defects with no history of meeting the above criteria. These repairs are not covered under our program. If the new buyer ever has a problem with the lateral and meets the criteria, he or she will then be able to apply for the program.

WHAT NEEDS TO BE SUBMITTED WITH MY

APPLICATION? The applicant must demonstrate a history of clearing blockages caused by roots, at a frequency greater than once annually. This should be done with two or more copies of receipts and a video showing the blockage.

If the pipe is collapsed, provide a receipt showing clearing of the line was attempted and a video showing it is blocked completely.

If a leak is causing a health hazard, please provide video evidence. Explain the nature of the leak and how it was verified, and provide documentation of a dye test by MSD or a reliable contractor.

If money is available from the program fund and the repair does not exceed the \$3000 cap, the contractor will bill the City directly for the repair. If the repair exceeds \$3000, the contractor will bill the homeowner for the excess over \$3000.

If program funds have been exhausted for the year, the homeowner must pay the contractor directly for the repair and homeowner will be reimbursed up to \$3000 when funds become available. When you make an application for a sewer lateral repair, you will be informed of the availability of funds.

Walk Safely

- Cross the street at corners, using traffic signals and crosswalks.
- •Look left, right and left again when crossing and keep looking as you cross.
- Put electronic devices down and keep your head up. Walk, don't run, across the street.
- Teach children to make eye contact with drivers before crossing in front of them.
- •Always walk on sidewalks or paths. If there are no sidewalks, walk facing traffic as far to the left as possible. Children should walk on direct routes with the fewest street crossings.
- Watch for cars that are turning or backing up. Teach children to never dart out into the street or cross between parked cars.

Trick or Treat With an Adult

• Children under the age of 12 should not be alone at night without adult supervision. If kids are mature enough to be out without supervision, they should stick to familiar areas that are well lit and trick-or-treat in groups.

Keep Costumes Both Creative and Safe

- Decorate costumes and bags with reflective tape or stickers and, if possible, choose light colors.
- Choose face paint and makeup whenever possible instead of masks, which can obstruct a child's vision.
- Have kids carry glow sticks or flashlights to help them see and be seen by drivers.
- •When selecting a costume, make sure it is the right size to prevent trips and falls.

Drive Extra Safely on Halloween

- •Slow down and be especially alert in residential neighborhoods. Children are excited on Halloween and may move in unpredictable ways.
- Take extra time to look for kids at intersections, on medians and on curbs.
- Enter and exit driveways and alleys slowly and carefully.
- Eliminate any distractions inside your car so you can concentrate on the road and your surroundings.
- Drive slowly, anticipate heavy pedestrian traffic, and turn your headlights on earlier in the day to spot children from greater distances.
- Popular trick-or-treating hours are 5:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. Be especially alert for kids during these hours.

Candy Safety

- •Do not eat any candy before an adult sorts and checks the treats at home.
- •Closely examine all candy for signs of tampering including:
 - -An unusual appearance or discoloration
 - -Tiny pinholes or tears in wrappers
 - -Spoiled or unwrapped items
- •Discard homemade goods, unless you know and trust the maker.
- •Do not eat or accept anything that is not commercially wrapped.
- •Remove choking hazards for young children including:
 - -Gum
 - -Peanuts
 - -Hard candies
 - -Small toys
- •When in doubt, throw it out.



Virtual-Mobile Crisis Intervention

On August 16, 2017, a new program was fully implemented for the Ballwin Police Department. This program is designed to put individuals who are experiencing an emotional

crisis in contact with a trained clinician. The program is called Virtual-Mobile Crisis Intervention (V-MCI). It works by setting up a virtual crisis intervention interview with a trained clinician via iPad. During this interview, the individual in crisis will be able to speak with a clinician, after which the clinician will advise the officer as to the best course of action for the individual. These options include a more in-depth evaluation at a local hospital or a site visit by BHR staff. Goals of this program are to provide more options to the officer on scene and to have the best outcome for the individual in crisis. V-MCI will be in conjunction with the Ballwin Police Department's Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) training. From January to August the Ballwin Police Department responded to 43 incidents that were classified as CIT incidents.

D.A.R.E.

D.A.R.E. is a comprehensive educational program designed to prevent or reduce drug abuse, and violence among students. The main focus of the D.A.R.E. curriculum is teaching students about personal responsibility, risk and consequence, resistance strategies, stress, responses to stress and communication. These classes give students an understanding into insightful decision making which they can put into practice throughout their lifetime.

The D.A.R.E. program also gives officers an additional opportunity to be in the schools and interact with the students each week.

The Ballwin Police Department typically offers this program for 5th graders in public schools and 6th graders at Holy Infant. Abbreviated programs have been offered to local scouting organizations as requested.

Parking Canopy



For years, the Ballwin Police Department has parked its official vehicles on the rear parking lot. The location of the vehicles will remain the same, but they will now be covered from the elements. Protecting the Police Department's vehicles from the elements will help keep them in the best condition possible, and ready for emergency

deployment, all year long. The parking structure was purchased from Absolute Steel & Storage in Tempe, Arizona. Hometown pride is not uncommon in America, but what it lacks in uniqueness, it makes up for with <u>zeal</u> in Ballwin.



LEAFCO

With cooler autumn weather, trees begin to shed their leaves. To assist residents, and to keep leaves out of the storm sewers, the Ballwin Public Works Department will collect leaves raked to the curb. This free residential curbside leaf collection program will begin this year on October 23. Leaves raked sooner can be put in appropriate yard waste bags or containers for pickup on yard waste collection days by the City's contracted waste hauler.

Unlike trash collection, we cannot guarantee which day of the week your leaves will be collected. Crews will be collecting leaves Monday through Friday, on city streets both north and south of Manchester Road. Crews will begin each day where they ended the day before. Once leaves have been collected on all streets, they will begin another pick up cycle. There will be NO pick up on November 23 and 24 due to the Thanksgiving holiday. Progress maps will be on the Ballwin website. These maps will show the streets where leaves have been collected and where each crew will begin the next day.

Due to weather conditions and shear volume, your leaves may NOT be collected each week or the same day of the week. This service may be curtailed due to adverse winter weather conditions.

The final pick up will begin the week of November 27, weather permitting. However, to assure your leaves are collected during the final week you should rake the leaves to the curb no later than Sunday, November 26.

Please do not park on top of or in front of leaf piles. Leaves that are not accessible will not be collected until the next cycle through the city. Crews cannot return to missed piles.

To minimize leaves washing into the sewers or becoming saturated during rainfall do not put them in the gutter. For safety reasons, leaves will only be vacuumed from the passenger side of the truck. Drivers are prohibited from driving in the wrong direction towards oncoming traffic. Therefore, leaves cannot be vacuumed from cul-de-sac islands or median islands. Also, leaves cannot be vacuumed if vehicles are parked on or in front of the leaf pile.

As a reminder, this service is only provided to customers of the City's contracted waste hauler. Properties that have a separate contract are excluded from the City's curbside leaf collection. Residents are also reminded; leaves will be picked up by the trash hauler as part of their yard waste collection provided they are put in yard waste bags or separate containers.

For the safety of the workers and the equipment, sticks, plants, root balls, metal objects, bricks, logs, animal waste must be kept out of the leaf pile. Piles of leaves with such debris will NOT be collected to avoid injuries and equipment damage which will cause delays. Also, do not block fire hydrants, storm drains, or mailboxes.



CALLIER'S HOME PLATE DELI

On June 30, 2017 Callier's Home Plate Deli closed its doors for good. While most residents have heard the news and will miss this high-quality deli, you may not know the real reason the owners made this decision. Thankfully, it's not the bad news you might think.

Callier's Home Plate Deli was, for 35 years, a portion of a family-owned business which also included Callier's Catering. According to Owner Dennis Callier, every year for the past 10 years, Callier's Catering has seen a double-digit increase in its catering reservations. "We have, for the past 25 years, emphasized our catering," said Dennis, "and every year it gets harder. Now, we're just really in a bind for space. So we're moving some of those operations to our dining room."


In reality, this change shouldn't be perceived as a closing of the deli, but rather an expansion of the Callier's Catering business. Using the room from the deli will give the catering operation more prep, cooking, and storage space to accommodate the business' growth. Seeing a Ballwin business thrive in such a way is certainly something to celebrate.

Dennis and Cindy Callier purchased the old Ruma's Deli back in 1983 as the site for their new business. Within eight months, they had catered their first wedding. Decades later, their catering business has served at hundreds of weddings, including three within the family of that very first customer.

"In the past, our employees were getting pulled back and forth. They were being asked to make a \$5 sandwich

and then prepare for a multithousand dollar wedding. We've finally decided we have to cut out the sandwich and focus on the wedding to ensure we are putting out our best product," said Dennis' son and co-owner Jeremy Callier.

"You can only grow so fast. Our growth so far has been really even and manageable. You don't want to grow too quickly and lose your quality. By growing at the rate we have been, it's really been a blessing," said Dennis.

Throughout the expansion, the Callier family has remained

grateful to their customers. "We've really seen the loyalty come out," said Jeremy. "That's why sandwich shops in St. Louis do well, because the neighborhoods really support them. Our community has been fantastic throughout the process and very supportive of the transition."

Are you planning to start a business in the City of Ballwin?


If so, the following checklist outlines the required steps. It is important to note this list is not exhaustive and other requirements may apply. City Staff is available to assist you, so please call or come in to discuss your plans if you have any questions.

For those already familiar with the process, this checklist is still a good way to make sure you have covered all your bases. This article is intended to be a resource for personal use and does not guarantee the City will grant a business license.

New Business Requirements Checklist

- Have you verified the address where you plan to set up your new business?
- Have you set up an in person meeting with the Director of Development? (*Please bring a one page, detailed, written description of your business plan.*)
- Have you confirmed the zoning and available parking on-site are suitable?

- If you are planning to build or make renovations to an existing building, have you obtained a building permit? (Make sure you or your contractor requests all of the required inspections throughout the construction process.)
- Have you applied for a Sign Permit?
- Have you applied for a Certificate of Occupancy? (Once your building passes all inspections; a separate inspection maybe required for issuance of the Certificate of Occupancy.)
- Have you applied for a Ballwin Business License? (You must have a business license to operate in the City of Ballwin. Fees for business licenses vary according to the type of business you are operating. The business license process will include verification from City Officials for compliance with zoning, building codes and to ensure the building is suitable for its intended commercial purpose according to City, State and Federal codes.)
- Have you contacted/registered with the other government agencies?
- Have you signed up for Shop Ballwin First?



Winterizing Our Parks

Mother nature never fails to deliver. The seasons continue to change, and we continue to respond. Stay outside and stay active, but be prepared for these changes in our parks.

As the seasons change, Ballwin amenities do as well. North Pointe Aquatic Center closed for the summer after Labor Day, and you will soon notice some changes in the parks. Here's what you need to know

1. Beginning November 1, the public restrooms in our parks will be closed for the winter.

This closure saves you, the tax payer, thousands of dollars in potential winter plumbing damage. Exceptions include: The Pointe at Ballwin Commons Park users may use the restroom inside The Pointe all year long anytime the facility is open, and Vlasis Park users may use the restroom inside the Police Department lobby. You can expect

all the restrooms to reopen April 1.

- 2. October 31 is the last day for picnic shelter rentals. Residents are welcome to continue using the shelters on a first-come, first-served basis, but no formal reservations will be made. Pavilions may be rented April-October each year. Reservations for the 2018 calendar year open January 1, 2018.
- 3. The tennis court lights are turned off November-January. Our lighted tennis courts are located in Vlasis and Holloway Parks and stay on until 11:00 pm and 10:00 pm respectively.
- 4. Fishing Ponds in Vlasis and New Ballwin Parks are stocked once each month, year round. New Ballwin is stocked with catfish all year. Vlasis is stocked with catfish February

through October and with trout November-January. Ballwin is one of only three cities in the St. Louis area to be included in the Missouri Department of Conservation's Urban Fishing Program (Ballwin, Ferguson, and St. Louis City). The Conservation Department pays for and stocks all the fish.

5. Ballwin's Golf Course and Club is open year round. Unless the ground is covered the Ballwin Golf Course remains open for play. Although you'll have to add an extra layer, you'll avoid the crowds of the summer months. Check the City's website or find Ballwin Golf Course and Club on Facebook to stay up to date with course closures.



You can easily do this today by going to republiconline.com and registering for our customer portal called "MY RESOURCE". Once your account is set up, you can keep your profile updated, pay your bill and request services through this portal. MY RESOURCE is also available as a phone app if you prefer to set it up on your smart phone.
- EXAMPLE CALL BLAST: Hello, this is Beth with Republic Services, your trash and recycling partner, with a service announcement. We will be closed on Monday, May 29 in observance of the Memorial Day Holiday. All services will be delayed by one day for the entire holiday week. Republic Services would like to thank you for being a valued customer and we wish you a happy and safe holiday!





Pointe Debit membership - The City of Ballwin will automatically debit your checking account or your Discover, MasterCard or Visa credit card. It must be from one or the other, members cannot alternate billing. The first month's payment and a \$20 activation fee is due at time of enrollment. There is a minimum of two automatic payments with the debit program. This program will not end until you give The Pointe written notice of your intent to cancel at least two weeks prior to your next debit.

Code of Conduct:

The Ballwin Parks and Recreation Department strives to create an atmosphere of respect and courtesy. Appropriate behavior and treatment of others is expected of all department employees, patrons and participants. Which Swim Lessons Do I Register For?

Seahorses (Ages 3 and under)

This 30 minute lesson gets the parents involved. The focus is to get the children comfortable in the water with the help and support of an adult family member. All of this is done through songs, games and fun activities the young ones will enjoy. A parent MUST be in the water with the child.

Tadpoles (Ages 3-6)

This 30 minute class is designed to get you comfortable in the water, away from the parents, and to develop good swimming habits and safe water practices. This is all done while learning the basics of going under water, floating, gliding, and the arm/leg actions they will incorporate in future levels. Most of the skills are done with support by the instructor or flotation device.

Clownfish (Ages 3-6)

Now you can start to really have fun by learning to swim on your own. This 30 minute class is designed to slowly get rid of the supports and teach you to

be more independent in the water by swimming on your own. This class will build on the skills learned in Tadpoles.

Stingrays (Ages 3-6)

You are swimming all by yourself now. But practice makes perfect and that's what this level is designed to do. This 40 minute class will focus on refining the strokes you've already learned so you can swim farther while also teaching you a few new tricks to put up your fin.

Sea Turtles (Ages 7-16)

Designed with the older kids in mind, this 30 minute class will teach you good swimming habits and safe water practices in and around the water. This is achieved all while learning the basic skills needed to swim on your own. The focus is to have you swimming short distances all on your own.

Sword Fish (Ages 7-16)

This 40 minute class is designed to build on what you have learned as a Sea Turtle. So pull out your sword and get ready to fight that water and swim farther. This class will focus of refining the strokes you've already learned while

teaching you a few new things that will allow you to go the distance.

Barracuda (Ages 7-16)

You are a lean, mean, swimming machine now and nothing can stop you. This is a pre-competitive, 40 minute class focused on refining your strokes even farther, increasing your swimming endurance, learning new strokes as well as flip turns, all to prepare you for a club swim team such as the Ballwin Blue Dolphins Swim and Dive Team or for swimming fun you can enjoy the rest of your life.

Swim Lesson Low Enrollment Policy

Each class session is designed to accommodate 3-5 participants over the course of 8 class meetings. However, swim lesson classes will not be canceled due to low enrollment. Classes with 1 or 2 participants enrolled will have an accelerated class schedule because of the ability to progress more quickly through each skill. Classes with 2 participants will meet for 6 class periods, and classes with 1 participant will meet for 4 class periods.




