## From the Mayor

### Tim Pogue

As we enter another budgeting season at the City of Ballwin, the Board of Aldermen and I are once again encouraged by the sound financial position of the City. In a time when transparency about government spending is increasingly valued and necessary, Ballwin sets a high standard.

We continue to receive awards such as the Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting and the Distinguished Budget Presentation Award by the Government Finance Officers Association year after year thanks to a committed and meticulous finance department.

Progress around the city in the form of major street improvements, facility upgrades and planning initiatives continue to move forward thanks to the strong financial climate. The board set a target three years ago to invest a minimum of \$1 million dollars annually for street repair and replacement. We have met or exceeded that target every year having invested over \$3 million dollars since 2016 thanks in part to our stable financial position. This is also reflected in the many development projects happening now, including the renovations at Ballwin Plaza and new businesses like Old Navy and Skechers moving into Central Plaza.

While sales tax from these businesses is certainly a major revenue source for Ballwin, it's interesting to note it actually represents less than half of our overall general fund revenue. A diversified revenue stream



helps protect the City from recessions and other economic downturns. It also allows us to present a balanced budget each year and pay for major capital improvement projects, like a new city hall, with cash. We are proud to say the city remains debt free, a trend we expect to continue as we head into 2019.

We do all of this while maintaining a 0% property tax because we're committed to running an effective and efficient system meant to serve and represent you. Any one of these reasons would be enough to call Ballwin the "Best Place to Live" or "Best St. Louis Suburb," but I believe it's the combination of all these factors and many more that make Ballwin such a truly special place to call home.

## From the City Administrator

There has been a tremendous amount of news about the future of recycling recently. In August, one of the two major recycling centers in the region announced they will no longer take single stream residential recycling, leaving many communities scrambling for an alternative solution to this very important service we all enjoy.

Many issues within the recycling industry are contributing to this issue not only in the St. Louis region, but also across the country. Countries overseas, led by China, are placing standards that are far more restrictive on the material they take with almost zero tolerance for dirty or contaminated recycled materials. The industry must adapt quickly or more facilities will continue to close around the region and country.

Where does this leave Ballwin? As you know, Republic Services is our trash/recycling/yard waste provider. Republic owns and operates a recycling collection facility for their customers and has pledged to keep it open and operational despite the industry challenges. We are under contract with Republic for four more years so thankfully we are not expecting any immediate impact on our residents. That being said, we must all do our part by not only changing the way we recycle, but also educating our friends and neighbors about the importance of practicing clean recycling. Some of the most common contaminates in our recycling carts include: plastic grocery bags, pizza boxes with either grease or pizza still in the box, jars, flattened cans, and bottles and cans still



filled with liquid that will contaminate the material as it is picked up and compacted in the recycle vehicle.

By doing our part to remove these, and many other contaminants from our recycling bins, we will continue to enjoy this service and help the environment by keeping these items out of our landfills. Failure to do our part will not only change recycling as we know it, but likely lead to significant cost increases in the future. In the past, a map system was used to show residents where leaf crews had left off the day before and the general direction they would be heading next. The City was divided into seven maps with a different leaf crew assigned to each section.

This year, Ballwin is trying a new, simplified system for collection and communication with residents. Rather than dividing

the city into seven separate maps with multiple crews spread out across the City, one master street list has been created.

Once every street has been serviced, the public works department will return to the top of the list to begin the process again.

The City believes this system will give residents a clear understanding of which streets are next on the list and where crews will be working. You'll be able to look at the list each day on our website and see how many streets were completed the day before. Since the speed of leaf pick up depends entirely on how quickly the leaves are falling, this master list will give residents an idea of how quickly the crews are working through the list.

# The City of Ballwin is taking a new approach to leaf collection.

As always, the best way for residents to help us keep the leaf collection service running smoothly is to keep objects other than leaves out of leaf piles. This means NO rocks, sticks, bricks, animal waste or scrap metal. If it isn't a leaf, it doesn't belong in the pile.

These items damage our equipment forcing us to take them off the road for repairs. This slows down the leaf collection process for everyone. Please do your part, and the City of Ballwin will once again work hard this fall to provide this service to our residents.

## The first round of leaf collection begins Monday, November 5, 2018.

#### A Reminder About Ballwin's Snow Removal Policies

Ballwin ordinances prohibit the parking of vehicles on City streets when the City is under a snow emergency.
A snow emergency occurs whenever snow accumulates to two inches or more or during freezing rain or ice. The Police Department will strictly enforce this ordinance. Read more at www.ballwin.mo.us/ Snow-Removal/

## Maintaining Ballwin Streets

There are approximately 263 lane miles of streets to maintain in Ballwin. Each of those miles is constantly battling a slew of structural distress from repetitive traffic and temperature changes, to settlement of the road bed due to water. If pavement is cracked, deterioration of the road accelerates even more quickly.

Preventative street maintenance is both cheaper and easier than total reconstruction. For this reason, Ballwin allocates funds to preventative maintenance every year. It's typical for the City to budget just over \$1 million annually on road construction and an additional nearly \$500,000 on preventative street maintenance.

Since the city is divided into four wards, Ballwin is committed to ensuring no area is left unserviced. These are the types of conversations had during the budgeting process for the next calendar year: How do we balance the need to repair streets and the need to perform preventative maintenance? And how do we address the needs across all four wards of the city?

As you can imagine, it's not a cut and dried process. But City staff and officials are committed to serving you and your streets. This is why Superintendent of Streets, Jim Link, is offering a new opportunity to ride the streets of Ballwin with him and see street conditions first-hand from his perspective.

Link will explain how he balances 31 Public Works employees between street maintenance, tree work, and seasonal work such as leaf collection and snow removal.

Ballwin's average PCI (Pavement Condition Inventory) is 6.8 (out of 10) as of the last street assessment, which is higher than many other municipalities in the region.

Ballwin's goal is to serve you in an efficient and responsible manner. The City has operated with a balanced budget for decades. Street maintenance expenses account for approximately 7-8% of the City's budget, which proves these improvements are of high importance.

## What **IS** a Right-Of-Way?

Generally, it is the area in front or back of your home between the sidewalk and the public street. Where sidewalks do not exist, the right-of-way is typically 10-12 feet from the curb line. (Note: The actual area of right-of-way varies by street and subdivision). Although it is owned by the City, and used by multiple agencies, the adjacent property owner is responsible for the maintenance of this area, including mowing. If you plan to make any modifications within the right-of-way area, including sprinkler systems, invisible fences, the planting or removal of trees, and driveway replacements, please contact the City of Ballwin prior to commencing any work. Movable objects should not be kept in the public right of way, including basketball goals and decorative landscape boulders, which may interfere with work crews and snow plows. If you plan to dig, be sure to call 811 to locate underground utilities first.

## What is **IN** the Right-of-Way?

Many of the services we use every day in our homes and businesses are located within the right-of-way area, most of which are not controlled by the City of Ballwin. Water and sewer pipes, telephone and fiber optic lines, power lines and poles, fire hydrants, gas lines, storm sewers and in some areas cellular towers are located in this area through pre-negotiated easement agreements between the City and utility company. The various utility companies, in cooperation with the City, own, maintain, and regulate the infrastructure located above or below ground within the area and the services they provide. In addition, the City utilizes the area for street signage and street trees, which the City is responsible for maintaining.



## All About Annexation

On Tuesday, August 28, the City of Ballwin presented a map plan to the St. Louis County Boundary Commission at a public hearing. Submitting this plan does not obligate the City to annex all or any of the included areas, but without a submitted map the City cannot pursue any annexation possibilities in the next five years. Residents can view this map on the City's website at www.ballwin.mo.us/Annexation.

Over the past few years, Ballwin has received an unprecedented number of inquires about the possibility of annexing various parts of unincorporated St. Louis County near our boundary lines. Mayor Tim Pogue said, "I've been mayor for 10 years in Ballwin, and I've received more requests for annexation in the last year than I have in the previous 9 years combined."

#### Interest is Growing.

The City of Ballwin knows these types of inquiries are

a positive sign. They show our community is doing something right. Our residents consistently tell us this is a great place to live and raise a family and the rest of the region is taking notice.

While growth can be exciting, there are a lot of logistical aspects to consider before Ballwin can move forward with any annexation plan and many questions which need to be answered.

#### Cost vs. Benefit

Updating Ballwin's Blueprint (the City's Comprehensive Plan) in 2018 has been a helpful resource in the annexation process. The firm hired to conduct this plan is also completing an in-depth cost-benefit analysis of various annexation possibilities. This analysis will heavily impact the City's decision to move forward with any annexation. The City has no interest in annexing new areas simply for the sake of growth. It is not Ballwin's intention to negatively impact any of

our current and valued residents.

For this reason residents can rest assured no tax increases are scheduled with the possibility of annexation. Ballwin has boasted a \$0.00 property tax for the last 30 years and has no plans to increase this rate for the sake of annexation.

The Ballwin post office covers a larger portion than our city limits which leaves many residents with the belief they live in the City of Ballwin when in reality they live in unincorporated St. Louis County. The best way to check if you're a true Ballwin resident is to look on your gas, sewer, water or electric bill. A small utility tax is indicated and will specify which entity receives that tax. If it says City of Ballwin, congratulations. You're a true Ballwin resident.

#### What's Next?

The annexation process is not a quick one. After initially submitting the map to the Boundary Commission on July 1, 2018 a municipality must wait an extended period of time before taking any further action, present to the commission, host public hearings and more. This buffer is built in to allow residents time to consider how the process might affect their homes and neighborhoods.

The STL Boundary Commission will notify Ballwin if the map plan was approved or denied by April 30, 2019.

#### What's in it for Ballwin?

For those already living in Ballwin, you may be wondering what's in it for you? Why expand and potentially burden City resources? Why change what's working? The answer is simple. Ballwin is ready. Chief Kevin Scott said it best in an interview about how

annexation would affect Ballwin policing, "It's an easy transition for us. We're built for expansion."

A small utility tax and pool sales tax in the annexed area would mean increased revenue for the City, allowing us to provide more of the services you already know and love.

Current residents would see no negative impact to their services. In fact with a larger population and increased revenue, residents would likely notice a positive change to their services and expansion of Ballwin parks and amenities.

When you're part of something good, you want to share it with others. Ballwin believes in offering great service and we're excited to potentially offer that service to more people in the future.

# Ballwin Historical Commission

The Commission's primary function is to promote, educate, and illustrate the history of Ballwin; its exploration, settlement, development and activities.

Organized on March 12, 1991 as the Ballwin Historical Society and later renamed the Ballwin Historical Commission, the commission was formed for the purpose of preserving and enhancing Ballwin's history and heritage. Its first project was to relocate the 1849 Harrison-Schmidt-Dahlke Log house to Vlasis Park in 1992. Relocation of the 1900 Old Ballwin Schoolhouse from what is now the Lowe's parking lot to its current Jefferson Street location later followed.

In 2015, a historic marker provided by the commission was placed at the original location of city founder John Ball's house. The discovery of John Ball's burial site was the next project. Originally, John and his family had been buried in Ballwin's Community Cemetery, but due to the widening of Manchester Road, the bodies had to be moved. The burial location was found in the Manchester United Methodist Church cemetery, where the Commission installed a historic marker at his grave-site. John Ball was an original founder of the Manchester church and William Douglas Bacon, builder of Ballwin's 1835 log cabin, was a Trustee.

The Historical Commission's duties can be found in the Ballwin Code of Ordinances, Article III, Sections

6-46 to 6-48. The steering committee consists of nine members, appointed by the mayor and approved by the aldermen.

The Commission meets the second Tuesday of every month at 2:30 p.m. at the old Ballwin Schoolhouse on Jefferson Avenue. All meetings are open to the public. It is preferred members are residents of Ballwin, but any person interested in local history is welcome.

#### City of Ballwin Holiday Service Guidelines

#### HOLIDAY SCHEDULE

There will be no collections on New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day or Christmas Day. The change in service days will be for that day on which the holiday falls. If the holiday falls on a Saturday or Sunday no change in weekly trash pickup will occur. – When the holiday falls on a weekday, ALL days following a holiday ROLL.

For Example:

If the holiday is on a Monday: Monday goes on Tuesday


Tuesday goes on Wednesday Wednesday goes on Thursday Thursday goes on Friday Friday goes on Saturday

Christmas trees will be collected at no additional charge. The tree must be free of all decorations including tinsel, garland, ornaments and lights. The tree must also be cut shorter than six feet (6') in length.

Bulky Trash includes any type of solid waste that cannot be placed into trash cart. Bulky Trash does NOT include major appliances, electronics, automobile parts or components, construction debris or any other such items. These items are to be serviced on the last pick up day of the month and scheduled for collection.

## Chief's Corner

### Dispatching

One of the most valued positions in our organization is that of our police dispatchers. These men and women work 24/7 to provide outstanding service to our customers. They are the first voice you hear when you need help. They are the lifeline for our police officers, providing them with information and assistance.

Calm and collected they answer the calls day in and day out to provide superior service to the communities of Ballwin and Manchester. Over 50,000 calls for service are answered every year by the Ballwin Emergency Communication Center.

Calls range from vehicle crashes to assaults to anything imaginable. Their days can go from 0-100mph with one ring of the phone and they are always ready to answer the next call and provide exemplary service to the caller.





In September, the Ballwin Communication Center received an upgrade. The room was stripped down to the bare bones and the communication operation was moved to an offsite facility. During this time, new flooring, ergonomic desks, lighting, and screen mounts were installed to make life a little better for our dispatchers. The technology of the room was also upgraded and is now ready for the next phase of the Next Generation 911 system. This process was funded by the St. Louis County Emergency Communications Center as part of a special tax which passed in order to upgrade all emergency communications in the St. Louis County area.

We love to show off this tremendous Ballwin asset to our customer base. We will be having a communications open house in the very near future, offering an opportunity for you to see this extraordinary operation and to meet some very talented folks. 
November 14th and coats may be dropped off in the lobby of the Ballwin Police Department.





he Metropolitan Sewer District's (MSD) Project Clear is urging the community to take action this holiday season by properly disposing of Fats, Oils, and Grease (FOG) instead of putting them down the drain.

FOG from butter, gravy, cooking oil, and sauces can look as harmless as liquids, and many people dispose of these substances down their drains. When they cool, however, FOG becomes thick and sticky, adhering to the pipes of our sewer system and potentially causing clogs, basement backups and sewer overflows. FOG can also cause issues in the pipes of your home, producing clogs or backups.

The Project Clear FOG program was designed to reduce the possibility of sewer pipe blockages and overflows by educating the community about how FOG affects the sewer system and how customers can properly dispose of these substances. More than any other time of year, fall and early winter see more of these types of issues, particularly around the holiday cooking season.

Fats, oils and grease are a by-product of cooking and are mostly found in the following:

- Meats
- Cooking oil
- Lard or shortening
- Butter or margarine
- Mayonnaise
- Food scraps
- "Hidden oils" such as salad dressings, syrup, batter, cheese, and whipping cream

FOG gets into our sewer collection system mainly from residential customers pouring the substances down their drains.

Since 2004, MSD has seen a more than 84% reduction in grease-related sewer overflows, due in part to the community's help in preventing FOG from entering our sewer system.


MSD asks the community for its help in continuing this trend, and reminds everyone not to FOG up our pipes this holiday season. To work effectively, sewer systems need to be properly maintained. MSD's Project Clear encourages all customers to do their part in maintaining their home's system and to use proper disposal methods as provided on top of page 22.

#### What Can You Do?

- 1) Wipe visible FOG and food scraps from plates, pots, and utensils into the trash for disposal.
- **2)** Never pour FOG down your sink drain, garbage disposal, or the sewer system.
- **3**) Encourage your neighbors to keep FOG out of the sewer system.

#### Cool it. Can it. Trash it.

- Pour cooled FOG into a container such as empty pet food, vegetable, or coffee cans.
- Allow the material to cool and solidify.
- Secure the lid and place it in the trash when full. Lids are available at your local municipality or at MSD's Administrative Offices.







In order to receive this VIP rate, residents must prove residency at The Pointe at Ballwin Commons by providing an unpaid gas, sewer, water or electric bill. Once you bring in your utility bill you can purchase a Resident ID Card for \$5 (must be renewed annually for \$1).

Non residents who are members of The Pointe at Ballwin Commons will also receive VIP rates.


# Parks Master Plan & Comprehensive Plan


