

From Your Mayor



We're just two months away from the start of a new year! I look forward to seeing all the change and growth we will experience in 2022, from welcoming new businesses to breaking ground on our new police station. However, one thing will remain the same every year, and that is our dedication to enhancing our community parks and amenities.

While the weather is still cool and crisp, I encourage everyone to check out our new and improved Ferris Park if you haven't seen it yet. In October of 2020, we began our phase two developments at the park which were completed this past August. New park amenities include walking trails and pathways, an expanded parking lot, redesigned recreation field, and an outdoor fitness structure.

We're also currently in the process of putting together a roadmap for our beautiful Vlasis Park, as recommended in our 2019 Parks Master Plan. We have hired the Lawrence Group to assess current park conditions and constraints, and then to use their assessments to produce a Master Plan for the park. This will serve as a guide for us to use as we work to renovate and enhance Vlasis Park over the next five-to-seven years. The Lawrence Group will host a public meeting to review this Master Plan (see page 16) and invites all residents to attend.

We placed considerable attention on enhancing our parks this year, and next year won't be any different! We have two major park updates happening in 2022 that I can't wait to share with you. As of last month, we were officially awarded a Land Water Conservation Fund grant to be put towards a brand-new playground at New Ballwin Park. We hope to receive a similar grant for our Holloway Park, which will be used towards a comfort station, a new playground, and the conversion of a tennis court to a pickleball court.

I want to thank all City staff for their hard work this year. Their dedication to providing quality services, programs, parks, and amenities for this community does not go unnoticed. I wish them, our residents, and our businesses a happy holiday season & a happy new year!

Ballwin Days began in 1978 when Mayor Richard Andrews commissioned a group of volunteers to develop an annual event that would provide an opportunity for the community to come together in a festive atmosphere. Mayor Andrews kicked off the first Ballwin Days by serving as the "dunkee" in the Dunkin' Booth.

Over the years, the Ballwin Days festival has provided a means for local charities and civic organizations to earn money to further their causes by providing food and games. Thousands of dollars have been raised for the Cardinal Glennon Children's Hospital through the "Pretty Baby" booth. Various athletic contests such as a run, golf, horseshoes, and tennis tournaments have added to the community celebration.

With the exception of a cancelation in 2020 due to the Covid-19 pandemic, the festival has continued without interruption since the original festival held in 1978. The Ballwin Days Committee volunteers work closely with elected officials and City staff to provide a family-friendly environment that includes community non-profits as well as a traditional midway experience.











Celebrating 189 Years: First Baptist Church of **Ballwin**

There's much to look forward to during the month of November... whether it's the promise of long-awaited family time, or the unofficial beginning of holiday decorating, shopping, and parties. However, for the members of the First Baptist Church of Ballwin, this November symbolizes something else entirely. They will be celebrating 189 years as a congregation... and honoring the tenacity, strength, and perseverance displayed by the church's founding members, who made it possible for them to be here today.

If you're driving south down Ries Road, you'll notice a brown, brick building to your left that sits right off the road. It's this building that members of the First Baptist Church of Ballwin (the second-oldest and continuously-operating Baptist Church west of the Mississippi) call "home."

Organized in the early 1800s but officially "founded" by slaves in 1832, the First Baptist Church of Ballwin has seen its share of hardships over the past 189 years. An excerpt from the Ballwin History Book reads, "In 1837, when members bought two lots from John Ball, ownership was denied [to] them because of rigid slave laws. It was 1853 before a legal way to purchase two other lots, these from Frederick and Mary Shelp for \$45, was found. Two successive log buildings were



built, and later a frame church was built."

After losing the original house of worship to a fire... and then the second to another one... and then the third to eminent domain, the church moved to its present location in 2009. Current pastor of the church, Leonard C. White, remarks on the importance of honoring the history of the church. "We all feel an obligation to do God's work and his ministry, but it's also always in the back of our minds to sustain this church," Pastor White says.

Sustaining the church hasn't proved an easy task for members throughout its history. Another excerpt from the same Ballwin History Book reads,

"Previously, because of harassment from vigilantes, the black congregation was not permitted to worship...Stories handed down through generations tell how early worshipers met at a grape arbor and even hid under iron pots to prevent their voices from being overheard. To avoid harassment by vigilantes during the forbidden worship, the early members strung ropes and wire fencing around the prayer area. This deterred horseback riding vigilantes just long enough for the worshipers to slip away safely."

Pastor White, a retired marine from Virginia and current Ward 4 Ballwin resident, has been a part of this church for over 20 years. He has served as the church's Pastor for the last six. Pastor White begins, "When I think about the history of the church, I am encouraged because I think about what it took for the church to endure all that it faced. If you've read the history, you know just what it went through for the church to be able to still be standing."

If you'd like to see the church, learn more about the history, or hear stories straight from the members themselves, then join them for a Sunday worship at 206 Ries Road. They will be celebrating their 189th anniversary on Sunday, November 14 and encourage everyone to stop by as they continue to live out their church motto, "Still standing. Still serving. Still praising."




Public Safety Tax

The City of Ballwin regularly receives questions about how it spends its public safety tax money. In 2017, St. Louis County voters approved a half cent sales tax to be used for Public Safety. This tax has generated \$5,275,801 in revenues for the City between October 2017 and December 2020. The City is committed to using these funds for the exclusive support of the police department.

With the passage of the tax came the opportunity to address issues that had been concerns of the police officers for years. Their top priorities were the correction of compression in the salary structure and enhancement of the pension plan. An additional dispatcher was hired and new protective gear for the officers was acquired. Technology spending has included upgraded computers used in patrol cars, a new evidence barcode system, and security cameras for holding cells. Approximately half of the revenues have been set aside each year to finance the replacement of the police station, with \$2,295,539 accumulated to date. Construction on the new station is expected to begin in 2022.

Leaf Collection

The City of Ballwin's Public Works department is once again offering our curbside leaf collection program. The 2021 program began on Monday, October 25 and will run through December. Here are a few program FAQs.

1) Is this offered to everyone in Ballwin?

This service is only provided for residents who are customers of our contracted waste hauler, Republic Services. With that in mind, leaves will not be collected from any multi-family units, such as condos or apartments.

2) How do I participate?

If you're a resident who wishes to participate in this program, you will need to rake your leaves to the edge of your yard during the collection season. Our crews will travel through each ward using the City's powerful leaf vacuums to collect the leaves. Please refrain from raking your leaves into the street or gutter, parking on the street infront of you leaf pile, and raking anything other than leaves into the pile. Leaves that are not accessible cannot be collected by our crews until the next cycle, and leaves with debris (sticks, plants, bricks, etc.) will be skipped entirely.

3) Do I have a set collection date?

Due to a variety of factors outside of our control (such as weather, manpower, equipment damage, etc.) we are not able to guarantee what day your leaves will be collected. However, we will have crews out Monday - Friday (excluding City-observed holidays) collecting leaves. At the end of each day, crews will update the Master Street List by Ward feature on our website. This list lets you view the streets our crews have just completed, in an effort to help you best guage when your street might be collected next.

4) Is this the only way to dispose of my leaves?

It's not. While we hope you take advantage of this free service, it is not the only way to dispose of your leaves. If our timeline doesn't match your needs, you can always bag your leaves for Republic Services' Yard-Waste Collection or mulch them on your own!

Ready, Set, Snow!

Whether you love it or hate it, winter is headed our way! In Missouri, we see our fair share of snow emergencies and ice storms, and the best way to get through them is by making sure you're prepared!

Before a forecasted snowfall, our crews spray salt brine (a combination of rock salt and water) on all streets. When snow accumulates to two inches, our City plows will take to the streets! Our crews will operate around the clock until the snow storm ends and all of our roadways are cleared. To make this process as smooth as possible, make sure to remember the following:

- Major streets and arteries will receive top priority, followed by collector streets, minor subdivision streets, and cul-de-sacs.
- Ballwin's City Ordinance prohibits parking vehicles on City streets during a snow emergency. This prohibition is in effect until the street has been cleared for emergency vehicles. Our Police Department will strictly enforce this ordinance.

Of course, our plows don't work against ice. If the forecast calls for freezing rain, we will spread de-icing salt about four hours in advance of the expected start.

If you have to travel during a winter storm, remember to use caution, give our crews room to work, and give yourself extra time to reach your destination. However, if you can avoid travel, please do! Instead, stay home, make some hot chocolate, cozy up by the fire, and leave the clearing to us!

Chief's Corner



Every police department is divided into different units. The Ballwin Police Department is no different. We have a variety of units including Patrol, Patrol Support, Detectives, Traffic Safety, School Resource, etc. The focus of this article is on a unit not uncommon in Law Enforcement, but new to Ballwin... the Chaplain Unit.

Department Chaplains are common amongst larger County, State, or Metropolitan agencies across the country. But the smaller the agency, the less common they become.

The question I often get is, "Why do police departments need Chaplains?" It's a fair question. Chaplains provide a valuable service, both internally and externally. Internally, we first look at officer wellness. Policing is a tough job. From the situations an officer sees, to how an officer is treated, can have an effect on an officer's wellness. The Chaplain is there to provide spiritual help and moral support to the officer and the agency. Additionally, following a critical incident, the Chaplain serves as part of a support system for the officers and their families.

Externally, Chaplains help us engage with the community, representing the department at functions and presentations. They also offer support to families whose suffering is brought to the attention of the department.

The Ballwin Police Department, considered a "small agency" in the industry, has a very robust Chaplain Unit. We started with an "unofficial" department Chaplain. He is a local Pastor who was introduced to the department through one of our officers who is a member of that church.

About 16 months ago, we began the process of building the Chaplain Unit. We wrote job descriptions, qualifications, expectations, and policies to guide us. A short time later, the unit was up and running with four Chaplains. These gentlemen ride with officers on patrol on a regular basis. They attend our different functions, and they lend support to the department and the officers.

We also reach out to them, asking them to respond to calls where we may find a community member needing support during a crisis, when appropriate.

The Ballwin Police Department's Chaplain Unit is, what I consider to be, a model in the industry. It helps that our Chaplains are fantastic! Pastor Kyle, Rabbi Joe, Pastor Dan, and Rabbi Ron, thank you for your support of our community and department.

- Monitor your banking statements in the following months after an online purchase
- Double check delivery addresses and tracking information
- Be cautious with suspicious emails. These may or may not be sent from the actual shop
- Avoid shopping on public Wi-Fi networks

Winter Warm Up

The hot summer months have come and gone. It is upon us to welcome in the colder and harsher months of winter. With that being said, nothing feels worse than waking up in a cold house, getting ready to leave, and realizing your car feels like an ice box. Over the past few years, many of us might have gotten in the habit of warming up our vehicles many minutes prior to leaving. We would start the car, five, ten, or maybe fifteen minutes prior to leaving and go back inside to continue getting ready.

While this is a conducive method of warming the vehicle up, it is not the best idea. Whether you leave the car running in the garage, the driveway in front of your house, or even at a gas station, it is presenting the opportunity for a criminal to steal your vehicle and the personal belongings inside.

A quick google search of "winter vehicle warm up" revealed numerous results and answers from various mechanics across the country. The consensus was that any modern vehicle built after 1995 only needs about thirty seconds to warm up. After that, the vehicle and engine should be good as long as the driver doesn't start racing immediately. The vehicle will warm up faster by being driven versus idling. By sitting in the vehicle for only 30 seconds, yes, you may be cold, but now you're not giving a criminal an opportunity to steal what you worked hard for... and you get to save gas.

During the last winter months of November 2020 through February 2021, the Ballwin Police responded to twenty-one stolen vehicles which were left running and unattended. The question you need to ask yourself is, "Is starting the car and leaving it unattended for a few minutes worth the possibility of losing your vehicle and personal items?" We can assure you, it is not.

Vlasis Park Master Plan



In June, Ballwin approved a contract with The Lawrence Group to develop a new Master Plan for Vlasis Park. The Master Plan will recommend park improvements, as well as new amenities, for our 28-acre community park in the heart of Ballwin. The design team will also be assessing the existing Public Works facility and discussing the best use of the soon-to-be vacant police building, which both reside in the western portion of the park.

The Lawrence Group will hold a public meeting to review the Vlasis Park Master Plan concept. This meeting is scheduled for 6 p.m. on Tuesday, November 16, 2021 at the Ballwin Golf Course & Events Center (333 Holloway Road, Ballwin, MO 63011).




